

LOCAL HIGHLIGHTS

NEED TO KNOW RECAP OF PINEWOOD PROPERTY OWNERS'

ANNUAL COMMUNITY MEETING

The Annual PPOA and quarterly Community Watch Meetings offer ideal opportunities for community members to gain insights and raise questions about issues of personal or communal interest.

Both meetings were held this past July. However, this report focuses on the Annual PPOA meeting, which took place on Saturday, July 20th, at the Pinewood Country Club.

PINEWOOD COUNTRY CLUB UPDATE

Rick Schmidgall revisited the history of the Country Club, highlighting that it was established in 1959 primarily to promote lot sales. Initially, purchasing property in Munds Park automatically granted membership to the Country Club. After some years, a legal challenge by property owners wishing to withdraw from membership led to a vote, transforming the establishment into a private club.

Rick underscored the central role of the Country Club in enhancing Munds Park's appeal and property values, particularly following a \$5 million upgrade that has attracted additional members.

Despite its exclusive membership, the Country Club actively supports the community in various impactful ways:

To support the development of the Fire Department's new station, the Country Club sold the basketball court for a minimal cost and donated the skateboard park.

In collaboration with the PPOA, they host BINGO nights benefiting the Pinewood Fire Department Auxiliary (PFDA).

They own Lake O'Dell and allow local residents access for recreational activities (please see page 15 for more details).

They partner with the PFDA to organize the annual Pinewood Golf Fundraiser.

UPDATE FROM FIRE CHIEF, JOSH TOPE

Fire Chief Josh Tope has announced a delay in the construction timeline for the new fire station, attributing the setback to a 41% inflation-induced increase in labor and material costs. Despite these challenges, the team is pressing forward with the design process and efforts to bridge a funding gap of approximately \$400,000. This shortfall has been accounted for in the overall budget of \$6.9 million, assuming no further price hikes occur.

The department hopes to begin the build by July or August next year.

Regarding community inquiries about the relocation of the basketball courts, a new location has yet to be secured, but efforts are ongoing to find a suitable site.

Bret Reports on Increasing Train Robberies

Train robberies are on the rise, with cartels exploiting open borders to loot rail cars, causing losses worth hundreds of thousands of dollars. Just last week, over a four-day period, cartels targeted and robbed 27 cars.

These robberies span from San Bernardino through to New Mexico. Authorities issue a stern warning: if you encounter a stopped train, particularly in the Williams area or wooded regions, do not stop or approach. Instead, immediately call 911. The individuals involved are bold and willing to use violence.

During the week of July 15, the Sheriff's Department, in collaboration with Homeland Security, apprehended a group of 40 individuals linked to these crimes. As law enforcement intensifies its efforts, the criminals grow more desperate. Many involved in these hijackings are coerced, with cartels threatening their families and employing other manipulative tactics to enforce compliance.

The cartels are now extending their criminal activities to target trucks as well. If you witness any suspicious activity, do not intervene—call it in.

An increase in Fire Citations Noted

Illegal fires pose a significant public safety hazard, prompting authorities to issue citations for every violation observed. However, about 80% of reported incidents actually involve legal fires, specifically campers using propane rings that comply with Stage I fire restrictions. This misreporting strains already limited resources. The public is urged to verify the illegality of a fire before making a report, to help ensure that emergency services can focus on genuine threats.

Enforcement Tightens on Unsafe OHV Use and Speeding

UNSAFE OHV USE: Authorities are no longer issuing warnings for unsafe operation of Off-Highway Vehicles (OHVs). Effective immediately, violations will result in tickets, and if the driver is underage, the vehicle will be impounded for 20 days.

SPEEDING: Residents noticing an uptick in speeding are encouraged to contact the sheriff's office to request increased patrolling in their neighborhoods.

GENERAL REMINDER: The speed limit throughout Munds Park is 25 miles per hour. This limit is enforced to ensure the safety of all community members and will be strictly monitored.

Coconino County isn't just vast—it's the second-largest county in the U.S. and a hub of crucial search and rescue operations. With only three deputies to handle an impressive 130-140 calls this year, the real heroes are the citizens who volunteer. Right now, 130-140 dedicated volunteers are standing ready to help.

ALERT FROM THE COCONINO COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

Ammon Barker, Chief Deputy for the County Attorney's office, visited Munds Park to raise awareness about a concerning trend: a rise in scams and identity theft nationwide. Last year, these fraudulent activities resulted in losses of approximately \$1 billion, with seniors—often those with substantial savings—frequently targeted.

To protect yourself, it's advised not to answer calls from unknown numbers. Thanks to advancements in artificial intelligence, scammers can now mimic the voices of your loved ones, making the calls seem frighteningly legitimate. To safeguard against these deceptions, establish a secret word or phrase known only to you and your family members. This simple step can help you quickly identify fraudsters. Stay vigilant; these scams are happening now, not just in the future.

Stay tuned, as the Pinewood News is collaborating with the County Attorney's Office to bring informative classes to Munds Park. These sessions will focus on navigating the increasingly complex landscape of scams and fraud. Designed to empower our community, they will provide essential knowledge and tools to protect against fraudulent activities.



For Those Who Make the Time to Cook Good Food

SLOW-COOKED CORN CHOWDER CELEBRATING SUMMER'S BOUNTY OF FRESH CORN

Hello! Let's cook up something special: a corn chowder that's perfect for this season—especially since so many of you have stocked up on fresh corn from Hauser Farms, known for their incredibly sweet and crisp corn. This recipe will let those fresh flavors shine.

Contrary to popular belief, corn chowder isn't just for the colder months; it's a versatile comfort food that adapts beautifully to any season. It serves as a light yet satisfying meal in the



summer, perfect for showcasing the season's bounty.

Start with the freshest corn you can find—right from the farmer's market. You'll strip those cobs down like they're the last ones on earth, grabbing every bit of sweet, crunchy goodness. Throw those kernels into the slow cooker with some hearty potatoes, chicken stock, and a bunch of aromatics like thyme, garlic, and onions. They're going to be the backbone of flavor for your chowder.

Now, the slow cooker is where the magic happens. You just set it and forget it. Go about your day, do your thing, and let that slow simmer work its wonders. After a few hours, those flavors will meld together into something really special. To finish, stir in heavy cream for that creamy texture we love. Then top it off with a fresh mix of bacon, red onion, chives, and a splash of lime juice—just to give it a little kick.

Here's what you'll need to gather:

- 14 ears fresh yellow corn (about 3 lbs.), divided
- 2 1/2 cups chicken stock
- 2 medium-sized russet potatoes, peeled and chopped
- 1 small yellow onion (about 5 oz.), chopped
- 4 thyme sprigs
- 3 garlic cloves, smashed
- 2 tsp. kosher salt
- 1 tsp. black pepper
- 4 thick-cut bacon slices, cooked and crumbled
- 1/2 cup finely chopped red onion (from 1 small onion)
- 2 Tbsp. chopped fresh chives
- 2 Tbsp. fresh lime juice (from 1 large lime)
- 1 cup heavy cream

Ready to get started?

- 1. Cut corn kernels from cobs using a sharp knife. Reserve 1 cup corn kernels.
 - Place remaining corn kernels in a 5- to 6-quart slow cooker. Working over a rimmed pan, use the back of the knife to scrape cobs to release all juices (the "milk") from cobs.
- 2. Add corn milk, stock, potatoes, yellow onion, thyme sprigs, garlic, salt, and pepper to slow cooker.
- 3. Cover and cook on LOW until potatoes are very tender and chowder has thickened slightly, about 6 hours.

In Munds Park, one name that resounds with warmth and respect is Tom Eade. Known for his amiable presence and profound contributions, Tom has been a cornerstone of volunteer efforts here since his retirement 23

years ago. His involvement with organizations such as the Pinewood Property Owners' Association, the Pinewood Fire Department Auxiliary, and the Munds Park Trail Stewards is driven by a heartfelt commitment to enhancing the place he cherishes as home—a commitment that has earned him his second Citizen's Award from the PPOA.

Tom's journey to Munds Park began post-graduation from UofA, leading to an unexpected settlement here instead of Colorado, owing to high costs. "A friend suggested Munds Park," Tom recalls. "Zelle, my wife and his Mother, explored the area, quickly fell for its charm, and didn't hesitate to purchase our first home here." This decision sparked a lasting bond with the community.

Quick to connect with his new neighbors, Tom found camaraderie and community through shared

outdoor activities. "Fishing and hunting brought many of us together," he notes. It was Dale Meranda, then president of the PPOA, who saw Tom's potential and warmly nicknamed him 'Kid' for his relatively early retirement. Dale's friendly persuasion led Tom to embrace volunteer work as part of his daily life in Munds Park.

Throughout his years with the PPOA, Tom has been instrumental in various initiatives, from beautifying the firehouse with a new planter box to managing the welcome signage at the entrance of Munds Park. His collaboration with Bill Spain in the tree planting initiative, despite mixed results and opinions, underscores his dedication. "We faced challenges, but succeeded in planting over a hundred trees," Tom admits. His commitment extends through the rhythm of the seasons, marking holidays like the 4th of July and Labor Day with community-enriching

projects, from flag placements to parade preparations. His service also includes a stint on the board of the Pinewood Sanitary District and collaborative county projects with local government officials, aimed at





Here are some key points from the update:

Capacity Challenges: Our treatment plant can handle 600,000 gallons of water, but in 2023, PSD received a staggering 2.3 million gallons within a 24-hour period. To manage this influx, the plant had to bypass excess water, which has led to regulatory scrutiny. We're currently under a consent order with the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) and the Attorney's Office, resulting in annual fines of \$50,000.

Public Cooperation Needed: The director emphasized the need for community assistance, particularly from owners of short-term rental properties. It's crucial to remember the three P's for what can go down your toilets: pee, poop, and paper. Products marketed as 'disposable wipes' and paper towels do not break down properly and should not be flushed as they cause severe issues and costs for our systems.

RV Sewage Warning: Residents should not allow RVs to dump into the sewer system. This is considered theft of services and there's no capacity for the extra inflow. If you observe such activities, please report them to PSD at (928) 286-9166.

Staffing Needs: The district is looking to hire more crew members. If you know someone certified for this work, encourage them to apply.

Legal and Billing Updates: The ongoing legal issues with the RV Park may soon be resolved. Also, moving forward, PSD will issue bills quarterly.

Community Concerns: During the meeting, a question arose about whether short-term rentals are contributing to the overflow. D.R. confirmed that these rentals use approximately five times more sewer services than residences. An audience member inquired about the possibility of charging short-term rentals more to offset the financial impact on the community. PSD board members are considering this but must find a legal way to implement such charges.

QUESTION FROM A READER



"I'm curious if anyone else is confused about this new sign appearing one day at the entrance to Lake O'Dell? Was this initiated by PWCC's attorneys to shield from legal liability? Is the PWCC board serious about restricting lake use to paid members ONLY? Back in the '80s a similar sign was posted, but ALL PROPERTY OWNERS were club members in those days."

We followed up with the Country Club at the PPOA meeting. Rick Schmidgall, board president, said the sign at Lake Odell is to discourage people outside of the Munds Park

community, including short-term rental guests, from using the lake. Hosts are not allowed to advertise the lake, nor are their guests permitted to use it. Munds Park property owners are allowed to enjoy the lake. The posted restrictions apply to everyone.



THE HEART OF TEQUILA: MEXICO'S SIGNATURE SPIRIT

Tequila's saga began long before it was poured into shot glasses. The distillation of agave dates back to the 16th century, introduced by the Spanish, although indigenous peoples had been fermenting agave long before their arrival.

The tequila we know today started taking shape in the late 1700s when King Carlos IV of Spain granted the first commercial license to produce this spirit. The Cuervo family received the first of these licenses, paving the way for tequila's commercial production. In the 1800s, the Sauza family revolutionized the industry by insisting that only blue agave should be used for tequila, setting a standard that defined its unique identity. This critical decision helped distinguish tequila from mezcal, its broader-category cousin. By the late 19th century, tequila began to be exported to the United States and beyond, marking the start of its global journey.



is the rulebook that keeps tequila true to its roots. These rules dictate everything from where it's made to how it's made. If it doesn't have the NOM seal, it's not the real deal.

The Spectrum of Tequila

The variety of tequila types caters to a wide range of palates and preferences:

Blanco: This is your raw, unadulterated tequila. Clear, sharp, and in-your-face with pure agave flavors. It's what you want in a cocktail that needs a kick.

Reposado: "Rested" in oak barrels for a few months, this tequila is smoother, with a subtle hint of oak. It's for those nights you want to slow sip and sayor

Añejo: Now we're getting serious. Aged for up to three years, these tequilas are complex, rich, with whispers of caramel and spice. This is the good stuff—pour it neat.

Extra Añejo: Over three years in the making, this is the elder statesman of tequila. It's deep, it's nuanced, it's almost philosophical. Sip it slowly.

How to Drink It

Choosing a tequila is all about how you plan to enjoy it. Mixing a cocktail? Grab a blanco. Settling in for a contemplative evening? Añejo is your friend. Whatever you do, respect the drink. Tequila's got a history, a soul, and yeah, it can kick your ass if you're not careful.

In the end, tequila is more than just a spirit—it's a craft, a heritage, and a vibrant part of Mexican culture. So next time you pour one out, remember it's not about getting buzzed—it's about experiencing a piece of history, one slow sip at a time.

The Art of Tequila Making

The making of tequila? It's a craft. A labor of love and a test of patience. Jimadores, the agave farmers, spend about a decade waiting for each plant to mature. When it's time, they get down and dirty in the fields, hacking away the leaves to unearth the piña, which then gets cooked to transform its starches into fermentable sugars.

What follows is a brutal crushing to squeeze out all that sweet agave juice. Fermentation kicks off the party, turning sugars into alcohol, which is then distilled to create that clear, potent spirit known as tequila blanco. This is where aging comes into play—if at all—to mellow the bite and deepen the flavor.

Keeping It Real: The NOM Standards

Nothing about tequila is laissez-faire. The Norma Oficial Mexicana (NOM)



- 4. Meanwhile, stir together reserved 1 cup corn kernels, bacon, red onion, chives, and lime juice in a small bowl. Chill until ready to serve, up to 6 hours ahead.
- Remove half of the chowder and set aside. Process the remaining chowder in the slow cooker using an immersion blender until smooth. (Or transfer half of the chowder to a blender and remove the center piece of the blender lid to allow steam to escape. Secure the lid: place a clean towel over the opening in the lid, and process until smooth.) Stir together reserved and pureed chowder in the slow cooker. Stir in heavy cream.
- 6. Divide evenly among 6 bowls; top evenly with fresh corn topping. This corn chowder is a celebration in a bowl, using ingredients that are at their peak. It's the perfect way to enjoy fresh corn and can be a staple at



BLACK PHOEBE & SAY'S PHOEBE

There are two species of Phoebes that are regularly found in northern Arizona. Phoebes are small flycatchers. I am lucky enough to see both the Black Phoebe and the Say's Phoebe regularly on golf courses. Both species, however, are found in different places on the course as well as in your neighborhoods.


The Black Phoebe is a small black and white flycatcher found primarily in the Southwest and along the California coastal regions. It has strongly contrasted plumage - black above and below with a white breast and under tail. Black Phoebes are almost always found around water, so you can also spot them at the edges of cattle tanks, lakes, and park fountains, for example, or you may notice one when you are trying to retrieve the golf ball you just miss-hit into a golf course pond. The Black Phoebe perches on tree and bush branches, and all types of posts and wires, and it flits down to catch an insect and then flies back to the spot it left. It can skim the surface of a pond and catch small minnows, but most of its prey are insects. You can see Black Phoebes in the Phoenix metro area around the irrigation canals, and once I even spotted a bird in our own back yard perched on the pool diving board.

Say's Phoebes are found throughout the West, all the way from Alaska to Arizona. The coloring on the Say's Phoebe is a gray-brown head and upperparts and a pale rufous belly and undertail coverts. Like the Black Phoebe, it is also a flycatcher and is commonly found around people, but it avoids water and dense forests. When I see the Say's Phoebe in Munds Park, it is almost always on the golf course, and it is on the holes that do not have water, such as number 13, 14, 15, and 16. Besides seeing it perched on a tree limb, you can sometime see it sitting on one of the white sticks indicating out-of-bounds or on the fencing that surrounds smaller trees to prevent elk damage. It flies low to the ground to pursue flying insects. Sometimes it flutters near vegetation to pick insects off the plants. Both of these species are monogamous and often produce two broods a season.





STARLIGHT STORIES

A MUST-WATCH AUGUST ASTRONOMY GUIDE

This August, the skies above Northern Arizona are set to host a breathtaking array of celestial events, promising both amateur stargazers and seasoned astronomers a spectacular summer show. From meteor showers to rare planetary alignments, here's what you can expect to see in our clear, mountain skies, along with the best local spots for stargazing.

Perseid Meteor Shower (August 12-13)

One of the annual highlights for sky watchers, the Perseid Meteor Shower is renowned for its bright, colorful meteors that often leave long, glowing trails. This year, the peak of the Perseids will coincide with optimal viewing conditions as the First Quarter Moon sets around midnight. The darker sky will unveil the full glory of the meteor shower, especially in the

This conjunction, set in the constellation of Taurus, will see the two planets passing extremely close to each other, visible as a nearly singular bright point of light. Such an event is a rare treat and will be perfectly visible from locations like the Coconino National Forest, where the horizon unfolds unobstructed.

Lunar Occultation of Saturn (August 21, 2024)

Prepare for a striking astronomical event where the nearly full Moon will elegantly slide in front of Saturn, temporarily hiding it from view. This event, known as a lunar occultation, will be visible right here in Northern Arizona. The dramatic interaction between our Moon and Saturn provides a perfect opportunity for those with telescopes to witness the gas giant reemerge from the moon's bright limb.



Large Planetary Parade (August 28)

Ending the month with a celestial spectacle, a rare alignment of Mercury, Mars, Jupiter, Uranus, Neptune, and Saturn will adorn the morning sky. This planetary parade will be a feast for the eyes, with most of these planets visible to the naked eye under the right conditions. Viewing spots like the high elevations around Sedona or the unlit roads of Munds Park might offer the clearest view of this rare alignment.

Best Stargazing Spots in Northern Arizona

 Lowell Observatory, Flagstaff: Ideal for a more structured viewing experience with professional

telescopes and guided events.

- Buffalo Park, Flagstaff: A local favorite for its accessibility and open skies, perfect for meteor showers.
- Sedona Airport Overlook: Offers expansive views of the sky above and the stunning landscape below.
- Munds Park & Rimrock: Known for its quiet, dark environment, making it a prime location for viewing the night sky without much light pollution.

Each of these events provides a unique opportunity to connect with the universe from our own backyard. Whether you're setting up a telescope or lying back on a blanket, Northern Arizona's dark skies offer some of the best stargazing conditions in the country. THE THINGS WE DO FOR LOVE

There are times when only the person who loves you the most will deal with your stuff.

We were living in North Dakota and had just had our 3rd child. Our oldest was 4, middle was 2 and still in diapers, and then we had our youngest. Sara, being the desert girl she is, was not thrilled to deal with the brutal winters and needed a break. She loaded up all three and boarded a plane for Tucson to visit her parents.

Sara is a pretty independent sort. I know plenty of moms who would not dare consider flying with 3 kids that young. Much less deal with changing planes in Minneapolis carrying all the paraphernalia that goes with the travel. Each had their own carry-on backpack. And two of them had to be carried between gates along with their backpacks.

By the way, did you know those electric carts that ferry passengers between gates are not for moms traveling with their kids? The cart driver refused to pick her up so one of the gate agents was nice enough to grab a kid and a couple of carry-ons to get them to their next flight on time.

Things were beginning to pile up on Sara this trip. Already, we had experienced what so many other parents had. When you have one child, you can share responsibilities. When you have two, you play man-to-man defense. But with three, you have to play zone, and it is too easy to lose track of any one of the three at any one time. Then came the trip to Tucson, changing planes, a cart-driver who was less than helpful, and then the diaper blow-out of all diaper blow outs.

They had just taken off on the flight from Minneapolis to Tucson. It is a flight of several hours. Our oldest had her activity book and was happy doing her thing. Our youngest was content in his mom's arms. Then came the odor wafting up from our middle. Our #2 had the nastiest #2 explode out of his diaper. Fortunately, he was wearing pants that had elastic both in the waistband and at his ankles. Unfortunately, Sara had carried on everything she needed for that trip except a change of clothes for the kids.

Airplanes recirculate the air. And what can seem like a large plane can get awfully small when the odor from your child begins to make its way from the front to the back. A very nice man sharing the row with Sara kept his eye on our oldest. A very nice flight attendant took our youngest in her arms and walked him up and down the aisle. All while Sara did what only parents who love their children will do. She dealt with the mess.

Those lavatories on the plane are not built for blow-outs and diaper changes like this. She got a bag for the clothes that she could tie off and contain most of the smell. But for the rest of the flight, he spent only in a diaper, and Sara spent hoping the odor would eventually dissipate into the

environment.

There are things that only those who love us the most will deal with because our stuff can get pretty stinky sometimes. Acquaintances will watch from a distance. Some might carry a light load for us for a while. But only a mom would dare unpack a mess like the one she encountered on that plane.

This is what Jesus does for us because He loves us. He died for us, embraces us in the midst of our mess, lifts us out it, cleans us up, and makes us presentable for His Father.

"A man with leprosy came to him and begged him on knees, 'If you are willing, you can make me clean.' Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. 'I am willing. Be clean.' Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cleansed." (Mark 1:40-42)

Leprosy was a nasty disease. It caused open, oozing sores in its victims. Extremities would rot and fall off. It was not uncommon for a victim to lose their nose, fingers, and toes to the disease.

It was also one of those diseases that scared everyone. It was terminal and uncurable. It was acceptable for people to throw rocks at those who suffered with it to keep them away. This man had had no social contact since his diagnosis.

It is significant that Jesus reached out and touched him before he healed him. Jesus embraced the man in the nastiness of his disease. Then He cleaned Him up and made him presentable for God and the man's friends and family.

Leprosy was also seen as an illustration of sin in our life and its consequences. Our body dies a slow and ugly death. But Jesus is not afraid to meet us in that mess and He is not affected by our mess. He affects us.

Jesus does for us what only someone who loves us the most would do. The mess we create of our lives can get pretty stinky. And that condition in a small, confined place can nauseate everyone around. Yet, Jesus takes us on and cleans us up.

Sara did for her son what only a mother would do. Jesus did for us what only our Savior will do. Surrender to Him and let him clean up your mess and make you presentable to His Father.
