

#### E-BIKES CAUSE SAFETY CONCERNS AT 4TH OF JULY PARADE

The 2025 7/4 parade drew the largest viewing crowd ever in Munds Park. There were a couple of minor infractions committed by parade participants. This leads to the conclusion that the parade was a success. However, there is a new situation that must be dealt with as quickly as possible before next year's parade.

For years, walkers and bicyclists have been allowed to be in the parade without any form of registration because this has been a rather small group of participants, and the thought was: what kind of trouble could they possibly cause? This year, there was a new version of bicycles called E-Bikes—bikes propelled with electric motors. When a large number of these showed up, they were routinely gathered up with the other bicycles staged at the last condo driveway and Walapai. When the parade started, they were guided into the parade between the sponsor car and the fire engine, as in previous years. I have often joked that I put them there so if any got run over, the fire engine would have medical personnel to take care of them.

This position in the parade lasted until the turn at Pinewood Blvd. According to Craig Hochgraef, who was driving the Grand Marshal car, many of the bikes sped up and got right behind the color guard in front of Craig. They were speeding back and forth, doing wheelies, and performing other antics. One of my monitors reported that one bike, while trying to do tricks, laid the bike down very close to a woman who was holding a small child on the side of the road.

This cannot be condoned, and we must nip it in the bud, as they say. I can only imagine the future of our parade if we allow this kind of behavior and someone is injured! I have been thinking of different kinds of procedures we can employ to eliminate this action. I called the Sheriff's Office to find out what is being done about this kind of

performance and was told that they have no ordinances regarding E-Bikes. Every incident is dealt with on a case-by-case basis. E-Bikes do not require licenses, riders do not have to get licenses, and they can be of any age. I was shocked, and I am determined to control the situation on my own.

Next year, E-Bikes will be considered motorized vehicles and must conform to the established rules for them. All E-Bikes must have a license plate, and drivers must be at least 16 years of age and possess a driver's license. They will stage with the other motorized vehicles and must maintain their position in the parade. If they get in front of the vehicles ahead of them, this will be a violation, and the monitors will record the violation. After the parade, I will contact them and suspend them from next year's parade. If they cause a commotion with the monitor or me, their suspension will be lifetime.

It is a shame that the current trend of civil disobedience has found its way to Munds Park.



#### TOUGH HANDS BUILT BETTER JOBS Looking Back this Labor Day

By 1917, America had a holiday for labor, but in Bisbee the men who tried to stand up for it got run out of town on a cattle train.

Bisbee, Arizona, 1917. Copper country. The kind of place where the mine whistle told you when to get up, when to eat, and when to quit. Phelps Dodge owned the mines, the payroll, the housing, and most of the town's say-so. The First World War had turned copper into gold, and the company wanted every last ounce pulled from the earth.

The men underground were running drills called widow makers. They chewed rock fast and lungs faster.

Wages were not fair. If your last name or skin color marked you as different, you got less. The Industrial Workers of the World decided it was time to push back.

Their strike was not about getting rich. They wanted two men on a drill, one fair pay scale for all, and a little less dying on the job.

Sheriff Harry C. Wheeler did not see it that way. A former Rough Rider, he was used to settling things on his terms. At dawn on July 12, he shut down roads into Bisbee and called up a posse of about two thousand men. Not deputies in uniform. Miners loyal to the company, shopkeepers, even ranch hands, all armed and ready to make a point.

They went door to door with lists of names. Some men on those lists were not even striking. That did not matter. Anyone who might be trouble got marched two miles under rifle barrels to Warren Ballpark. Once there, Wheeler gave them a choice. Renounce the strike and walk away, or refuse and take a ride. About seven hundred men took the walk. The rest stood their ground.

By midmorning, 1,186 men were crammed into cattle cars that stank of manure. It was July in the Arizona desert. After a long run through

the heat, the train stopped at Hermanas, New Mexico, near Columbus, a bare patch of nothing. Armed guards told them to start walking and never come back.

News spread fast. President Wilson's commission called the deportation "wholly illegal and without authority in law." But the law had no way to make kidnapping across state lines stick, and local juries were not about to convict their own. Not one man who carried out the deportation served a day in jail. The strike collapsed. Phelps Dodge kept its grip on Bisbee. Conditions changed little in the years that followed.

It would take nearly twenty years and a national change in labor law before miners in America could count on the right to organize without risking a one-

way ticket out of town. The Wagner Act of 1935 put those protections in writing. Federal mine safety laws arrived later, with real inspections and standards. By then, most of the men hauled out of Bisbee in 1917 were scattered, retired, or gone. They did not see the gains they fought for, but they started the fight that made them possible.

Here is what I want you to remember. Those miners did not win that day. Most never came home. But the fight they started lit a fire that shaped the rights we have now. Safer workplaces. Fairer pay. The idea that you can speak up without being run out of town.

And maybe that is the rub. They fought for a work ethic that built something solid. Today, plenty of jobs are still hard and honest, and that is the point. The ground is sturdier than it was because tougher hands laid it down. So when you clock in tomorrow, remember. Someone before you paid for that time with more than sweat.

#### AN EXCLUSIVE ARIZONA WINE CLUB ROOTED IN 100 YEARS OF HISTORY

You ever drink something so good you want to know where it came from? Not the store. The dirt. The people. The stubborn history that put it in your glass. That's D.A. Ranch.

In 1910, Gertrude Gates bought 360 acres in Cornville, Arizona, and branded her Jersey cows "Delta Alpha Ranch," D.A. for short. She built a sandstone home with a library that was more than a dusty collection. She lined her shelves with books, records, and notes. It was a working room, a place for ideas and planning, maybe even the occasional whisky-fueled conversation about what to do with the herd.

Over time, the ranch changed hands. One owner was Vesto Slipher, an astronomer who discovered galaxies and probably counted stars from the front porch. Then came 2002. The Petznick family bought what was left of the ranch and began putting it back together. They planted Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Tannat, grapes tough enough for Cornville's rocky soil and blistering days. In 2008, they bottled their first wine and named it "Gertrude." Not to sell a story, but to honor one.

Today the ranch covers 170 acres along Oak Creek, with nine acres of vines set among oaks, pastures, ponds, and fruit trees. The tasting room is a converted bunkhouse, the kind of place where you lean back on the porch, look out at the vines with Sedona's red rocks beyond, and start rethinking your schedule.

This November, they are launching the Arizona Wine Club. Locals get in first, the rest of the country in February. The Homestead tier offers three bottles twice a year for \$150 per release. The Ranch tier gives you six bottles, including at least one Reserve, for \$300. The Estate tier is twelve bottles heavy

on Reserves, eight complimentary tastings, private event invitations, free shipping, and first rights on limited releases for \$550. All members get early event access, Wine Wednesdays with live music, and local discounts. By fall 2025, an upstairs Member Lounge will open. In 2026, they will release a clubonly, small-batch wine that will not be repeated.

Cornville is not Napa. Its history is filled with grit and ambition still whispering through every vine and bottle. And if you ever find yourself here, with a glass of "Gertrude" in hand, you're not just tasting wine. You're tasting history and love of the land.

#### Not a Member?

Membership has its privileges, but D.A. Ranch has never been about keeping people out. The tasting room welcomes guests Wednesday through Sunday from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m., unless a private event is underway.

On Wine Wednesdays, from 2 to 5 in the afternoon, there's live music and the easy hum of conversation. It's a fine way to spend the afternoon.

From April through November, the Vineyard Walking Tour offers a closer look. For fifty dollars, you'll spend forty-five minutes among the vines, taste four distinct wines, take home a D.A. Ranch glass, and enjoy fifteen percent off any bottle or piece of merchandise you decide to carry out.

The wine club will always have its reserved tables and rare vintages. Yet the ranch remains a place where anyone can step onto the porch, glass in hand, and feel like they belong. Just as it should be.



#### PEACH SEASON, TWO WAYS TO POUR IT

#### The Bourbon Peach Smash

**DICK TRUDEAU** 

There's a reason bourbon has lasted through wars, Prohibition, and more than a few questionable cocktail trends. It's honest. There's no mistaking that first inhale: caramel, oak, a whisper of smoke if you've chosen wisely. The good stuff doesn't need a gimmick, but it does enjoy a little company.

The Smash is an old American style of drink, dating back to the early 1800s, meant for warm weather and whatever fruit was in season. Back then, it was mint and maybe a lemon wedge, crushed with sugar and spirits in a heavy glass. You didn't need a bartender's playbook; you needed a sturdy hand and a decent muddler. It was the country cousin to the Julep, less ceremony and more "let's cool off after the game."

This version trades in tradition for peaches, which are hitting their peak right now. Soft-skinned, heavy with juice, and perfumed in a way that reminds you summer still has a few good weeks left. When you muddle them with mint and a little simple syrup, the glass blooms with color and scent. Add a high-rye bourbon and you have a drink that walks the line between sweet and heat. Finish with ginger beer if you like a little snap, or soda water if you prefer the bourbon to keep the spotlight.

This isn't a drink for sipping politely. It's meant for the porch, for a warm afternoon with good company and no reason to check the clock. The kind you finish, then reach for the muddler again, because like bourbon itself, it's that good.

#### **Ingredients**

- 1/2 to 1 ounce brown sugar simple syrup
- 1/2 large peach, diced (about 1/2 cup)
- 3 to 4 large fresh mint leaves
- 2 ounces good bourbon
- Splash ginger beer (preferred) or seltzer water, chilled
- Ice (Crystal ice from the store is best)
- Fresh mint and peach slices, for garnish

#### The Method

- 1. Add peaches, mint leaves, and simple syrup to the bottom of a cocktail shaker. Gently muddle to release the peach juices and mint oils. Avoid over-muddling the mint, which can make it bitter.
- 2. Add bourbon, fill the shaker with ice, and shake until well-chilled.
- 3. Strain into a rocks glass filled with fresh ice. Top with ginger beer or seltzer water. Garnish with fresh mint sprigs and a peach slice.

The Smash proves a good drink that only requires fresh peaches, good bourbon, and a glass that feels right in your hand. Make one, and before the ice settles, you'll already be thinking about the next.



#### Peach Bellini

Come on in, honey. Kick off your sandals, drop your bag on the counter, and grab a glass. We're doing Peach Bellinis, and yes, it's still morning. That's the whole point.

This isn't your run-of-the-mill mimosa. This is Italian summer in a flute, even if we're in the middle of mountain country with a hound stretched out in the doorway. Back in 1930s Venice, a very dapper bartender named Giuseppe Cipriani decided fresh white peach purée and sparkling wine needed to meet. The second they did, it was magic, the kind that makes you lose your train of thought. He named it after the painter Giovanni Bellini because the soft pink-gold color reminded him of the warm tones in Bellini's work. Art inspired it, glamour sealed it, and brunch claimed it forever.

#### What you'll need

- 2 ripe white peaches (yellow if that's what's rolling around the farmer's market this week)
- 4 oz chilled Prosecco (don't cheap out, she's the main character here)
- Simple syrup if the peaches are acting shy on sweetness

#### How to do it

- 1. Peel the peaches. Yes, peel them. We're going for smooth here. Toss them into a blender and whirl until you've got something that looks like a summer sunset. Strain if you want to feel extra bougie.
- 2. Pour the purée into a champagne flute, about a third full.
- 3. Top with cold Prosecco. Slowly, darling.
- 4. Give it one gentle swirl so it looks like they've been together forever.

And now, here's the rule. Once you start, you don't stop at one. This is a drink for lingering. For sitting around the table while the peaches are still fragrant in the bowl, the music's low, and everyone's telling stories they probably shouldn't.

Because mornings are better with bubbles.



If your Peach Bellini or Bourbon Peach Smash is going to be fabulous, start with the best fruit you can find. #### MAKE YOUR LABOR DAY BBQ LEGENDARY

#### Sweet & Spicy Rum BBQ Sauce!

Ah, my dears, lean in. I'm about to show you how to make the kind of BBQ sauce that makes grown men guard the platter. Labor Day is coming and that means BBQ season at its best. We trade hard work for good food and better company. With napkins piled high and the smoky aroma drawing guests to the grill, summer's last big party is about to get delicious. What tips barbecue from good to great? Sauce. The sticky, messy, glorious kind you brush on as it cooks, layering flavor until a simple cut turns into a celebration.

So why fuss over sauce? Because it's the

final touch that makes the barbecue unforgettable. It's finger-licking, plate-scraping good, and if you're doing it right, no one leaves the table clean or hungry. This Labor Day, while the coals glow and laughter drifts through the yard, remember that the best food isn't fancy. It's cooked with soul and shared with the people who matter most.

And if you really care, you won't insult your guests with bottled sauce off the production line. Only the freshest ingredients, a splash of rum, and the recipe below are worthy of sharing with good friends and family. Serve it up, watch them hum, and don't forget to pour yourself something strong. This is what real cooking looks like.

#### **Ingredients**

- ½ cup dark brown sugar (Dark brown sugar brings nearly twice as much molasses as light brown, but if that's all you have, regular brown sugar will do the job.)
- ½ cup rum
- 1 jalapeño, sliced thin (with seeds)
- 4-5 cloves garlic, chopped



- 5–6 fresh basil leaves, chopped
- 1 tablespoon apple cider vinegar
- 1 tablespoon fresh orange juice
- 2 tablespoons teriyaki sauce
- 1 cup ketchup
- 1 teaspoon chili paste or chili powder
- Dashes of fresh ground black pepper

#### How to Make Magic

Start by tossing all the ingredients into a sturdy cast-iron pan and stir.

Let the sauce simmer gently on low heat for 20 to 30 minutes, just until it thickens and begins to shine. Give it a taste and try not to eat it by the spoonful.

Pour the finished sauce into a dish and bring it to your grill station. This is where the real fun begins.

Here's the trick with barbecue sauce: most, including this recipe, is loaded with sugar, and sugar loves to burn if you're not careful. If you slap your sauce on too soon or cook over high heat, you'll end up with burnt char instead of that perfect sticky, amazing glaze.

The secret? Wait until the last ten minutes of grilling. Grab a brush and paint that sauce onto your meat. Give it a little time to caramelize and build a crust. If you like things extra sticky, go ahead and add another coat or two as you finish up.

Sure, you can use BBQ sauce as a condiment after the food is cooked, but you'll miss out on that magical crust and deep flavor that only comes from the heat of the grill.

Note: If you're cooking low and slow, like with a smoker, you can sauce as you please. Lower temps mean the sugar won't burn, and you'll get deep, smoky flavor with every bite.

#### FOUR 'OLD' GUYS GO CAMPING - WHAT COULD HAPPEN?

We must have been a surreal sight as numerous kayakers stared at us cruising along at 3 mph in our little caravan led by the skiff towing our 10' supply barge - which was listing badly. After an hour or so we reach an area that shows promise for the flat land high above to set up camp. The problem was, we would have to beach and haul the 700lbs of gear up the rocky slope. Our de facto 'captain' is undeterred and hikes up to survey the situation leaving


abandon any plans for finding a campsite anywhere. Which then leads us to the sad realization that we were going to have to pack out our boats and gear back up that horrific 500' rocky ramp to get back and head home before sundown.

Somewhat depressed, we cruise back but are interrupted by the sound of six folks laughing uproariously at us from high above on the forest road. Our captain hand signaled that we needed help hauling our gear up and out and that money would be paid. This made them all laugh even harder.

As we pull up on the ramp, those same six (four dudes and two women) greeted us and offered to assist. They had already packed out and walked all the way down to the ramp to help these exhausted four old guys, can you believe it? And so, for the next hour all ten of us hauled our crap up the ramp with these muscle-bound dudes carrying the heaviest loads. 

#### THEY CALLED THEM MUTINEERS The Forgotten Story of the Port Chicago Disaster

A FORWARD FROM UNSTOPPABLE STACEY

This is a story not only of tragedy, but of a long-overdue reckoning. Visiting the Port Chicago Naval Magazine National Memorial in northern California gave me the chance to walk the grounds where injustice unfolded and where remembrance now stands in its place. The Port Chicago Disaster is not my history. It belongs to families who lived it, to the voices that rose up despite injustice, and to communities who have carried its weight for generations.

Nothing prepared me for what I experienced at the Port Chicago Memorial. I knew I had to carry it forward—as a witness, a writer and someone who believes travel should move your heart, not just vour feet.

#### Port Chicago: The US's Largest WWII Homeland Disaster

It happened late at night on July 17, 1944, when most of America was asleep and the war was raging in the Pacific. At Port Chicago, a naval munitions base near Concord, California, young Black sailors loaded massive numbers of bombs onto ships.

They had no formal training. They were told the explosives weren't live. Safety procedures were brushed aside in the rush to meet quotas.

"It was an accident waiting to happen," reported Walt Bilofsky of the Treasure Island Museum.

Then, the unimaginable: an explosion equal to 2,000 tons of TNT. The Port Chicago Disaster killed 320 men instantly—202 of them Black. That single moment accounted for 15% of all Black casualties during WWII.

The Port Chicago Memorial now stands on that very site, a quiet place where the water meets broken piers, and history still echoes.

#### Just When You Think It Couldn't Get Worse...

The surviving sailors were transferred to nearby barracks. A few weeks later, 259 of them were marched back to other docks and ordered to resume loading munitions.

They stopped.

Fifty of them refused, fearing another disaster. For that, they were branded mutineers.

Today, the Port Chicago Memorial remembers both those who died and the 50 who said no. Their courage stood at the intersection of military duty and civil rights.

#### Was It Really Mutiny?

The trial was rushed. Just eight weeks after the Port Chicago Disaster, the Navy tried 50 men for mutiny even though no direct orders had been disobeyed, and no conspiracy proven.

Thurgood Marshall, then attorney for the NAACP, attended the trial. "This is not 50 men on trial for mutiny," he said. "This is the Navy on trial for its whole vicious policy toward Negroes."

The 50 men, each of whom constitutionally should have had his own defender, were given only four attorneys. "A travesty of justice," said Jody Iorns of the Contra Costa Bar Association.

That injustice lit a spark that helped desegregate the Navy and later, the entire US military. But justice moved slowly.

#### A Long Road to Exoneration

In 2024-80 years after the blast-the US Navy finally exonerated the Port Chicago 50.

One year later, I stood on the very ground where the massive explosion-registering 3.4 on the Richter scale-took place. The 78th Secretary of the Navy, Carlos Del Toro, addressed the crowd: "We must always gather to pay tribute, because too many do not know their stories." He was the official who exonerated the Port Chicago 50 last year.

Sean Coffey, the now-retired Navy General Counsel who led the

exoneration investigation, followed him. "This is truly a sacred place... not only because of the lives lost, but because of the struggle for justice that went on for 80 years."

#### Port Chicago Weekend: From Tragedy to Tribute

On Thursday, July 17, I joined a group headed to Golden Gate National Cemetery for the "Remember & Honor" event, part of the Port Chicago Weekend. Among the white headstones, I met Sherri Culpepper, who traveled from New York City with her granddaughter. Her uncle, Cyril Sheppard, had been one of the 50. She came to ensure the next generation knows this story.

Sandra Evers-Manly of the Black Hollywood Education and Resource Center also stood with us. "Through his eyes and voice, I learned about Port Chicago," she said of her neighbor, a survivor. "Their sacrifice gives us the freedom we have today. Lay your hand on the gravestone and say thank you. I remember you."

I did. That day, our group, which included young students, visited 43 graves. The Port Chicago Memorial Weekend ensures those men are never forgotten.

#### Saturday of the Port Chicago Memorial Weekend

The Commemoration Ceremony on Saturday brought together descendants, military leaders and others. Riding the bus, I met Vickisha Keys, great-granddaughter of survivor Alex White. "He could not stop talking about Port Chicago," she said.

Carol Cherry displayed photos of her father, Cyril Sheppard. "I remember sitting in my Dad's car and him telling me the story of Port Chicago," said Spencer Sykes II, whose testimony helped with the exoneration. We spoke before the ceremony began. "He had to tell it to me over and over again to burn it in."

Secretary Del Toro reminded us, "We must stand together in the struggle to reach the Promised Land." Sean Coffey honored "ordinary, committed citizens who held our government to account."

We stood for funeral honors. Taps played. Police boats dropped wreaths in the bay. The broken piers, remnants of the Port Chicago Disaster, seemed to watch like wooden sentinels.

Each visitor was handed a flower. Some tossed theirs into the water. Others took them home. I held mine longer than expected. When I finally let it go, it felt less like a goodbye—and more like a promise to carry their story forward.






#### Local Author Lou Blazquez




Summer Munds Park resident Violetta (Vy) Armour is a frequent contributor to the Chicken Soup for the Soul Series, having published five essays in their books since

#### **GARDENING IN THE PARK**

#### FALL PLANTING: A SECOND SEASON FOR GARDENERS

As we prepare to bid farewell to another high-country summer, it might be tempting to think that the gardening season is winding down. But fall is a second season for gardeners

> in northern Arizona. It's the ideal time to plant trees, shrubs, and hardy flowers, plus it's your only window to get those springblooming bulbs in the ground.

So instead of putting your tools away, consider this your green light to keep growing.

# Why Fall is Great for Trees and Shrubs

Many gardeners instinctively wait until spring to plant trees. And sure, it makes sense; longer days, warmer weather, and a flush of new growth. But in many ways, fall is actually better.

Here's why: while air temperatures are dropping, the soil stays warm well into October. That warmth encourages trees and shrubs to grow strong root systems without the stress of producing new foliage or summer's heat.

Our monsoon season also helps saturate the soil, encouraging deep root growth. That's essential for trees to become established and weather the dry conditions that can come with spring and early summer. That said, newly planted trees still need regular water.

Even if there's been rain, you'll want to soak your tree generously at planting, then daily for the first two weeks. After that, every other day should suffice until winter truly sets in. (During winter, water once a month.) A root stimulator like Fertilome's can help encourage vigorous growth. And don't forget to mulch! It helps retain moisture, suppress weeds, and regulate soil temperature.

Here are a few planting tips:

- Dig a hole twice as wide and as deep as the tree's root ball
- Amend the soil (we recommend Warner's Supreme Planting Mix)
- Water your tree thoroughly before planting
- Remove any wire or fold back burlap from the root ball
- Use mulch, but keep it a few inches away from the trunk
- Water deeply (drip irrigation systems are ideal, but a slow hose trickle works too)

#### Don't Forget the Fall Flowers

Fall isn't just about trees. It's also the perfect season for refreshing your planters and flower beds with cool-weather blooms that thrive in the crisp air, such as mums (the unofficial flower of fall), asters, and pansies and violas, which come back for a second season after their spring debut.

Fall flowers do well in containers, which makes them easier to water even if you've shut off your drip systems for the season. Just make sure to place containers in full sun, as shorter days mean less light, and these blooms still love their sunshine. And here's a quick tip: deadheading your late-summer bloomers will encourage just a little more life from them before the first frost.

#### Bulbs Now, Blooms Later

Want daffodils, tulips, crocuses, and hyacinths next spring? You need to plant now. We always have folks come into the nursery in March asking for daffodil bulbs—and by then, it's too late.

To set yourself up for a beautiful spring, plant bulbs in late September through October when the nights are cool, but the soil is still workable.

#### Here's how:

- Choose a sunny spot with well-draining soil. If your soil is heavy with clay, amend it with planting mix.
- Plant bulbs three times as deep as their size: big bulbs (like daffodils) go in about 8 inches; smaller ones (like crocus) about 4 inches.
- Always plant with the "nose" or pointy end facing up.
- Water after planting, and then wait for nature to do the rest over winter.

#### Don't Stop Growing

Fall is a season of transition, but not of endings. You can still be harvesting cool-season veggies like kale, spinach, and arugula, or starting fast-growing crops like radishes and onions. Just be sure to factor in your local frost dates when starting from seed.

Whether you're extending your blooms with colorful containers, investing in long-term beauty with trees and shrubs, or planting bulbs for spring glory, fall is full of gardening potential.

#### UNDERSTANDING SHOULDER PAIN MECHANICS MANAGEMENT & MOVING FORWARD

Shoulder pain can be highly debilitating, limiting both function and quality of life. Understanding the mechanics of the shoulder and how to care for it can empower you to stay active and pain-free.

#### "Mostability" Mobility + Stability

A healthy, functional shoulder is both mobile and stable, what we like to call "mostability." While that may sound simple, it's often easier said than done. Over time, chronic wear and tear, inflammation, or degenerative changes can reduce mobility in key areas, including:

- The glenohumeral joint (the main shoulder joint)
- The scapulothoracic joint (where the shoulder blade moves)
- The thoracic spine (your upper/mid back)

Even stiffness in seemingly unrelated areas like the hips can throw off shoulder mechanics, particularly during activities that involve rotation like golf or tennis.

#### Why Stability Matters Too

Stability is just as crucial. The rotator cuff, made up of four small muscles, acts like a pulley system that keeps the ball of the shoulder (humerus) centered in its socket. Weakness or imbalance in this system allows the humeral head to shift improperly, pinching tendons, irritating the bursa, or accelerating joint degeneration.

Poor posture contributes too. Rounded shoulders and a forward head position alter the alignment of the shoulder blade, setting the whole system up for dysfunction before you even move.

#### Common Causes of Shoulder Pain

- Osteoarthritis of the glenohumeral or acromioclavicular (AC) joints: causes stiffness, pain, and limited motion
- Rotator cuff tendonitis or tears: reduce joint stability and control
- Postural impingement: often due to weak upper back muscles and an exaggerated curve in the thoracic spine
- Faulty movement patterns: especially during activities like golf or pickleball. Limited hip mobility or poor core control can force the shoulders to compensate
- Systemic inflammation or hormonal imbalances: can also contribute to pain and restricted range of motion

#### Treatment: It's Time to **Get Active**

#### Stretch Smart

Target the shoulders, neck, midback, and even hips to improve overall movement quality.

#### Strengthen Wisely

Focus on the rotator cuff and the muscles that stabilize the shoulder blade (especially the lower traps and rhomboids).

Avoid painful or highload exercises that worsen symptoms.

#### Improve Your Posture

Counteract the effects of sitting and tech posture. Daily posture resets can go a long way in reducing stress on the joint.

#### Use Modalities as Needed

- Heat: Soothes arthritic joints before gentle mobility work
- Ice or topical analgesics: Reduce inflammation
- NSAIDs: May help short-term; consult your healthcare provider

#### Address Diet and Inflammation

Anti-inflammatory foods and supplements like turmeric, vitamin C, glucosamine/chondroitin, magnesium, and high-quality protein support tissue healing and joint health.

#### Know When to Seek Help

If pain persists beyond a few weeks or worsens, see your physician. You may benefit from physical therapy to guide you through targeted exercise and mobility strategies. In some cases, imaging (MRI) may be necessary to evaluate for tears or structural damage requiring surgical intervention.

Your shoulders are involved in nearly everything you do, from reaching and lifting to swinging a racket or hugging a loved one. Don't ignore discomfort. Early attention can prevent chronic issues down the road.

Stay active. Stay strong. Live the life you love.











# TURKEY VULTURES DOING THE DIRTY WORK FOR NATURE


The Turkey Vulture is one of three large, almost completely black birds we see in Northern Arizona. The other two species are the Common Raven and the American Crow, both which live here year-round like many of us. But it is the Turkey Vulture that comes and goes with the weather, migrating hundreds of miles, usually in large flocks, to wintering grounds such as Costa Rica.

Turkey Vultures breed throughout the United States except for Alaska and Hawaii. An old nickname for them is "buzzards", and some people consider them ugly birds because their heads are completely free of feathers and instead show only red, bare skin and a white beak. Turkey Vultures are beautiful in the air, however, barely beating their wings in flight as



they glide through the skies seeking out their next meal - a dead animal. These birds have a keen sense of smell and while soaring can locate carrion more than a mile away. Turkey vultures play a critical role in keeping our environment safe: helping to prevent the spread of serious diseases like botulism and anthrax. You can consider them the winged vacuum cleaners of our planet.

Turkey Vultures are monogamous and monomorphic – the latter meaning both the male and females are similar to each other in size and look. They have a six-foot wingspan and a black body. When they are in flight, you can see that the front of their wings is completely black and their tail and the back wing feathers are gray. In spite of their appearance, Turkey Vultures have many human fans. At least five birding festivals in the U.S. specifically celebrate the return of the Turkey Vulture from their winter migration, including one in Bisbee, Arizona, in March.

#### LOCAL LORE

#### THE MOGOLLON MONSTER WALKS THESE WOODS



Spend enough time along Arizona's Mogollon Rim and you'll hear the name, usually after dark when the fire burns low and the forest seems a little too quiet. The Mogollon Monster has been part of Arizona lore for more than a century. Folks say he's seven feet tall, built like a barn door, covered in matted hair, with eyes that catch the light in a way that makes you wonder if you should put another log on the fire or start packing the truck. And then there's the smell that assaults you before you even see him, like the smell of a skunk mixed with a dead skunk. It's said to be that bad!

The first time the story appeared in print was back in 1903, when The Arizona Republican ran an account from a man named I.W. Stevens. The paper referred to the creature as a "wild man." Stevens swore he had seen it near the Grand Canyon, standing over the bodies of two cougars. According to him, it was not just standing there, it was drinking their blood. Whatever

curiosity he had, vanished the moment it turned toward him. The thing let out what he called "the wildest, most unearthly screech" and chased him off.

In the mid-1940s, Don Davis, who later became a cryptozoologist, recalled being on a Boy Scout camping trip near Payson. One night he woke to find a massive figure just feet away from his tent. It had broad arms, a square jaw, and a face that gave nothing away. Davis could not make out every detail. The dark swallowed its features, but the smell rolled over him thick and foul, the kind that makes your eyes water and triggers your flight instincts.



From the 1980s into the 2000s, residents on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation started reporting more sightings. In 2006, White Mountain Apache tribal police lieutenant Ray Burnette told reporters the frequency had gone up and the witnesses were credible. One woman, Marjorie Grimes, described a tall, black figure striding through the woods with steps far too long to be human. She turned away for a second and it was gone, leaving only the sound of her own breath.

The legend has kept pace with the times. In 2015, a driver on State Route 260 reported a massive, dark-furred figure running across the road at twilight. It disappeared into the forest without so much as a snapped twig. Sightings like this keep trickling in, often just enough detail to keep the monster alive in conversation and just vague enough that you cannot quite pin it down.

Witnesses over the years have described the Mogollon Monster as seven feet tall, foul-smelling, with glowing red eyes and an unsettling knack for sound mimicry. Some say it whistles. Others claim it can imitate animal calls. And then there are the campfire storytellers who insist it has been known to pull the heads off deer before feeding.

Munds Park is not just a spectator in this tale. It sits right in the middle of the playground where the legend runs free. Better watch out!

Whether you believe it is a real creature, a misidentified bear, or the best prank the forest has ever played on people, the Mogollon Monster has a way of showing up when you least expect it. And if you are out in the pines one night and hear a whistle where there should not be one, run!

It's getting a stuck truck out of the mud with nothing but chain, grit, and a prayer you'll still have all your fingers when it's over.

It's messy. The job always takes longer than you thought. You end up inventing a few words you wouldn't say in church. But when it's finished, there's that quiet satisfaction of knowing you didn't wait around for someone else to do it.

Labor Day is for the scrafflers. The people who keep going until the thing is done, no matter how ugly the process. Without them, the hay doesn't get in, the roof keeps leaking, and the gate stays swinging open.

So here's to the scrafflers. Pour them a drink, hand them a plate, and let them sit for a minute. Tomorrow, they'll be back at it.


