The Munds Park Business Alliance (MPBA) embarks on its 13th year with a slew of fresh plans to build upon its mission of building business partnerships for a stronger community. The MPBA executive committee, Bill Spain, President, Deanna Bascelli, Vice-President, Len Friedlund, Sec/Treasurer and Sandee Caviness, At-Large Director, met throughout the winter season to draft a calendar of events to present to the Alliance on April 21, 2022. Lots of exciting ventures await this season as the MPBA expands its presence in Munds Park.

The MPBA annual membership renewal is wrapping up with a May 15 cutoff date for businesses to renew or join. The group expects about thirty-five business members in 2022. Each business pays \$100-\$250 annually to join the Alliance, depending on the business size. Monies collected go towards operating and conducting the events MPBA sponsored each year. One of the benefits of membership includes advertising their business on the Post Office sign located on Pinewood Boulevard at the "Outpost." Only MPBA member businesses are invited to advertise on the Outpost Billboard.

MPBA general meetings occur every other month during the summer. However, group meetings for the various committees are held monthly, depending on the event or project. The next general meeting of MPBA is June 16 at 4:30 pm at the Munds Park Community Church. The next Executive Committee meeting is scheduled for May 18 at Provident Partners at 11 am.

Call to Action for our Fire Districts

Our Fire Districts are wrangling with considerable cost increases in operations and fuel—Just like everyone today. To ensure our Fire Districts have proper funding, we're asking for your support by signing a petition to make certain the Arizona Fire District Safety Act gets on November's ballot.

WHAT IS THE ARIZONA FIRE DISTRICT SAFETY ACT?

- 1. Our State is home to 144 fire districts, which provide fire, emergency medical, and associated emergency services to more than 1.5 million residents and tens of millions of travelers on Arizona roadways.
- 2. Many of these fire districts are located in rural parts of the State, with personnel serving as first responders in the event of emergencies or accidents on large stretches of widely traveled highways.
- 3. Our fire districts are critically underfunded, leading to personnel and equipment shortages and extremely long response times in many areas of the State.
- 4. To ensure that fire districts can provide prompt and effective emergency services throughout the State, we must solve this funding crisis. This Act would do so by imposing an additional sales and use tax increment of 1/10 of 1% that is, just one penny for every \$10.00 you spend for a period of 20 years.

As you can see, it's not a big ask. Even with today's inflation, it's safe to say we can afford one penny for every \$10 we spend to provide our first responders with the tools they need.





SMART TIPS FOR EMERGENCY FOOD STORAGE II

Last month, in the April 4 edition of the paper, I wrote about 'Smart Tips For Emergency Food Storage' and listed some situations where having food storage might be helpful.

Situations like job loss, natural disasters, illness/death, and I talked about storing the food you actually eat. For example, if you don't eat Spam, then by all means, don't store a case of Spam!!! Further, buying in bulk always saves money! And you don't have to have a large family to buy in bulk!

I listed three layers of food storage:

Layer one: your kitchen pantry.

Layer two: Short-term food storage.

Layer three: Long-term food storage.

Today, I'd like to focus on Layer two, short-term storage. Most of us, I'm sure, have a working pantry with the basics in it. But how do you store food to keep it fresh and safe from bugs and animals for six months or longer? Obviously, food bought in a can will store easily. I usually have a case of tuna or chicken in my short-term storage. However, what about food like pasta or rice that comes in a box or bag? How can you buy those items in bulk and keep rodents or bugs out? There are several ways you can store these items safely.

The first way is called dry canning. If you have a vacuum sealer like a Food Saver, you can purchase an attachment to seal a glass canning jar with dry ingredients inside. For example, I currently buy my rice and pasta in bulk through Azure Standard, then place them in a large $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon canning jar and seal it with my Food Saver. This is a great way to make those items shelf-stable for a long time.

Putting an oxygen absorber inside just makes it that much safer. Why? Well, in case you didn't know, most of your grains, flours, and rice come with minute bugs/larva. Gross, I know. But true. Putting those bags in the freezer for 48 hours will kill them. However, you don't have to do that if using an oxygen absorber. If there is no oxygen in the jar, bugs cannot

survive!! And a rodent cannot eat through a glass jar. So when I use up a jar in my pantry, I just pop open one from my short-term storage.

The second way to store food safely is in Mylar bags and/or food-grade buckets. The best mylar bags I have found are Wallaby. They are guaranteed airtight, moisture-proof, and light-blocking. They are made with BPA-free, food-grade & food-safe materials, and a 100% money-back guarantee backs them. They come in all sizes and include oxygen absorbers and labels for the outside of your bag. Some come with a ziplock-like seal, but I also seal the top with a hair straightener/flat iron. You can find many instructional videos about this on YouTube. The heat melts the bag together and

seals it completely!! Here are just a few foods that store well in Mylar bags with an oxygen absorber, including how long you can store them:

Oats – up to 30 years

Potato flakes - up to 30 years

Dried beans - 10-30 years, depending on type of bean

Pasta – up to 30 years

Wheat berries - 10-30 years

Ground flour - 2-10 years

White rice – up to 30 years

Sugar – no oxygen absorber, infinite shelf life

Salt – no oxygen absorber, infinite shelf life

Baking soda – no oxygen absorber, infinite shelf life

Ground coffee - 10-20 years

Powdered milk - up to 30 years

Cocoa powder - 2-5 years

Popcorn - forever

Herbs – 2-10 years

Corn starch - 2-10 years

Bread crumbs – 2-5 years

Baking powder – no oxygen absorber, 2-5 years

GROWTH THROUGH ADVERSITY

Walking through Spain and COVID

John Muir, known as Father of National Parks, said, "Don't be scared to walk alone. Don't be scared to like it." Having just returned from a 455-mile solo trek across Spain, I can tell you, solitary walkers need to hear these sorts of assurances. Let's face it, setting out

alone can be scary business. And if you stop to think about it, adversity is sure to come in various ways during long-distance trekking. However, just as Muir hints, those who overcome the hardships will enjoy the experience.

Psychologists call the phenomenon 'growth through adversity.' Or when walkers struggle with highly challenging life crises like illness, trauma or a global pandemic, it's called 'post-traumatic growth.' While walking Via de la Plata—an ancient pilgrimage route—I thought about how my tough experiences in Spain paralleled our challenging journey through COVID here in our local communities.

Op-ed discussions and news articles now ponder how we can now leverage our past COVID experiences to a more positive 'new normal.' What have we learned about ourselves during this adversity that we can take with us to make our future lives better? The COVID question is the same that pilgrims ask themselves when they return home.

Positive psychological change experienced as a result of struggle

Adversity can create positive psychological change. As with demanding long-distance walking, social distancing and quarantines gave us opportunity to look within and examine our hearts. Are there places of ourselves that would benefit from change? What are the areas in our lives that we ignore? Places where we could welcome change or conditions where change could be difficult but beneficial?

According to a 2004 study published by Psychological Inquiry, post-traumatic growth "is manifested in a variety of ways, including

- an increased appreciation for life in general,
- more meaningful interpersonal relationships,
- an increased sense of personal strength,
- changed priorities, and
- a richer existential and spiritual life."

Increased Appreciation for Life

Overcoming obstacles like finding your way when lost in a hail storm or seeking a place to sleep when there is no room at the inn can give the pilgrim feelings of gratefulness for the most simple things in life. Likewise, those homebound or otherwise isolated by

the pandemic have found increased appreciation for life. We might hear ourselves saying, "Well, at least I didn't have the terrible experiences that others had during COVID." Or, like I said, after a horrific accident left me with severe brain damage, "I grew so much through this, wouldn't change a thing." In what ways has the pandemic increased your appreciation for life? If it has not, consider writing a list of what you're thankful for and adding to it each day.

Food-grade bucket with a gamma lid.

The third way to store food in your short-term storage is in a food-grade bucket with a gamma lid. The gamma lid twists off from the seal allowing for easier access. I store my bulk flour, salt, and sugar in 5-gallon food-grade buckets and dip into them when I need to refill my pantry. You can also keep your mylar bags in a food-grade bucket for extra protection from rodents and just for convenience. Food-grade buckets stack well and save space.

Besides food and water, there are some non-perishable items that you should keep on hand for an emergency. These include

things like batteries or rechargeable batteries, solar charger, medical first aid kit, crank and/or battery operated radio, fire flint, life straws that filter water, pocket knife, flashlights, and extra medications, to name a few.

With fire season on us, it is also a good idea to pack a 72-hour bag or a GO bag. This is a bag that you could grab quickly, and it would have all you need for 72 hours. You would pack one for each person in your home. In addition from the above, some things in the bag might be snacks, water, a change of clothes, and an emergency blanket. And for kids, you might add their favorite games, toy, snacks, and books.

There is so much to cover when talking about being prepared for emergencies. But I hope these last two articles have given you at least some food for thought (pun intended), if not, some ideas and ways to get started.



LEARN ABOUT THE SUN & THE STARS!


Did you know kids living in cities cannot see as many stars as you can in Munds Park? That's because we're a Dark Sky community and everyone who lives here does their very best to keep the lights out at night.

This city is filled with streetlights, lighted signs, and house lights, causing the night sky to be bright, keeping us from seeing the stars and planets. The brightening of the sky is called light pollution.

We're lucky to live in or visit Munds Park. The stars shine bright, and we can clearly see how beautiful the night sky is!

It's fun to learn about stars. Let's break it down to understand how our sun and stars work.

DEFINITION OF A STAR, AND HOW THEY SHINE!



The Sun

A star is an exploding ball of burning gas held together by gravity. Our sun is a star! It produces great amounts of energy in the form of light and heat that provide the perfect conditions for life on Earth.

When you look at the night sky, the dots of light you see are stars! They are millions of miles away. Billions of stars exist in the universe, but many are too far away from Earth to see, even with a telescope.

Stars are huge balls of burning gases, most of which are made of hydrogen. As the hydrogen gas in a star is squeezed due to gravity, it produces huge amounts of energy, which make it glow. The size, temperature, brightness, and color of stars vary.

The color of a star is determined by its temperature. Red stars are cooler in temperature, blue stars are hottest, and other stars like ours (which is yellow) are an in-between temperature.


STARS COME IN DIFFERENT SIZES AND DISTANCES FROM EARTH.

Stars are really far away from Earth. With a strong telescope, we can see stars that are millions of light years away.

A light year is how far light can travel in one year. Since light travels at 186,000 miles per second, it takes 8 minutes for light from the sun to reach the Earth.


The next closest star to Earth is Proxima Centauri, which is a little over 4 light years away from Earth. That is 250,000 times farther away than the sun!

The brightest star in the night sky is Sirius, located 500,000 times further away than the sun. Sirius is

also 20 times brighter than the sun, which is why it is so easy to see at night. Know what else? Sirius is 8.6 light years away. That means the light hitting your eye has been traveling for 8.6 years. Put another way: When you look at Sirius, you see it as it was 8.6 years ago!



Earth is the perfect distance from the sun.

OUR SUN IS A MEDIUM STAR OF AVERAGE SIZE AND BRIGHTNESS.

Our star, the sun, is average in terms of size and brightness. However, our star is extraordinarily important! Earth is the perfect distance from the sun.

The sun provides heat and light to our planet, supporting life on Earth. Earth is in the safe zone of the sun. We are close enough to the sun to benefit from the light and heat but far enough away to prevent Earth from being too hot and vaporizing all the water.

The sun is much larger than Earth. By comparison, if the sun were the size of a basketball, the Earth would be the size of a pencil point.

STARS THAT ARE FARTHER AWAY APPEAR SMALLER AND DIMMER.

Because the sun is so much closer than other stars, it looks much bigger and brighter. Objects that are closer to you seem larger than

objects that are farther away.

If you were to light two candles, hold one and have a friend hold the other on the opposite side of a room, the candle you are holding would appear brighter and bigger. The same is true of stars.

Tonight, get your parents or friend, step outside and enjoy the wonders and the beauty of the stars and planets!

It's great that you're out there dating even if it's in a small town. When dating, make sure you are safe and that someone knows where and when you are meeting the person.



More meaningful interpersonal relationships

Although I left for Spain alone, I knew that I would walk with friends. I just hadn't met them yet. Still, trekking with people from other cultures and of disparate personality types can manifest inward discomfort and adversity when navigating meals, beds and opportunities for solitude. Those struggles could be similar to being cooped up with your spouse or family members during corona virus quarantines. Yet, many pilgrims report that overcoming adversity on the trail eventually brings them closer to fellow travelers. Many leave the path with lifelong friendships. Similarly, couples say their relationships are stronger after coming through the hardships of pandemic sequestering. Can you name people in your life with whom your relationship became more meaningful during COVID?

Others, like me, decide to quit their corporate jobs to find more meaningful livelihoods. Being in adverse situations can make you reevaluate your life and make changes. How have your priorities changed in the last two years?

Richer Existential and Spiritual Life

Over the past 17 years that I've walked Camino de Santiago routes, most people I meet declare that they are not walking for religious or spiritual reasons. They tell me how they left their parents' church and are now agnostics. Still, at the end of a long walk, some of these same folks report having spiritual experiences at the endpoint, the Santiago Cathedral. They are filled with feelings, which sometime they can't explain. I experience a deeper existential and spiritual life during and after times of hardship on the path. When my body breaks down from the hunger and exhaustion produced by weeks of walking, my emotions are apt to boil over. Pushing through and dealing with unleashed emotions helps me connect with God and the spiritual part of my being. Looking back, can you see where you've had a deeper existential and spiritual life since the first COVID outbreak?




- Two Nights in Lisbon

Want an international thriller with a strong heroine, an unreliable narrator, and lots of twists and turns?

Ariel Pryce wakes up in Lisbon, alone.

Her husband is gone with no note and isn't answering his phone. Something is wrong.

She starts with hotel security, then the police, then the American embassy, each time confronted with a question she can't fully answer. What exactly is John doing in Lisbon, and how many times has he been here? Why did he drag her to his business trip this time?



Ariel knows so little about her new, and much younger, husband. But now the clock is ticking. She has received a ransom demand for 3 million euros.

There's only one person she can ask who has that kind of money, but her request is going to open a political can of worms. As she starts trying to raise the ransom money, it quickly becomes clear that there's more to Ariel's backstory—and husband John's--than what we're seeing.

Although the story kicked off quickly, you have to be patient and follow the twists and turns, because it's at this point when the book really gets interesting. It's also when I realized that I was dealing with an unreliable narrator, and it heightened my attention to the details as they unfolded.

We begin to learn more about Ariel's story—her life and abuse, her son, and how she came to meet and marry John. By now, we also have the police, the embassy, and the CIA interested in exactly who this third person is she's contacted and who would give her that kind of money.

The story takes place over just two days, and the pace is almost exhausting. It all leads to some surprising final revelations and an ending that feels satisfying.

It's sad that we still live in a world where women are considered "hysterical," and dismissed or gaslighted when they speak up and share factual information. The underlying bit of this story is how serious crimes against women are swept under the rug by rich male perpetrators who can silence those crimes by throwing money at them. I have such respect for Chris Pavone for writing a strong female protagonist's point of view and nailing it.





Jesus is the word of God. That is, God spoke, and it was written in the Old Testament that He would send His Son to the earth. Jesus is the manifestation of those words. God spoke, it happened just as He said.




