



HOME COOKING THE ART OF MAKING SMASH TACOS!

If you've been reading my articles for any length of time, then you know I love tacos! As a true Arizonan, I could eat Mexican food for almost every meal. But, I am picky about my tacos. The spices in the meat must be similar to what I grew up on in Tucson. Taco seasonings all have similar ingredients, but they vary dramatically in flavor. The flavors I love are deep but subtle. A few years ago, I found an online homesteader who creates and sells her own taco mix, and I love it!!! It is the first premade mix that has come close to the flavors I grew up on. I first tried her seasonings when I won a drawing on Instagram, and it was included in the bundle. I quickly fell in love with her flavors. That Christmas, I bought everyone in the family a bag of her seasonings as I looked to support small businesses when buying my gifts. My kids now expect a large bag of her seasonings in their stockings every year. If you would like to try them, you can find them here: linktr.ee/ourlittleplateauhomestead. My all-time favorite taco is a fried taco from my childhood. I did an article about that a while back, but if you missed it, I will post the recipe at the end of this article! However, I might have a new favorite taco I am trying to perfect. I follow quite a few food profiles on Instagram, and about a month ago, I started seeing everyone talk about the "smash taco". It was going viral for sure! I'm sure you have heard of the smash burger. Restaurants like Freddy's and Smashburger have made them very popular. The patty is smashed down, creating a thin patty with a crusty outside. The smash taco is similar. It's made on a flat top or in a cast iron skillet and is smashed down with a tortilla on top. It ends up very similar to the fried taco and is delicious. When I say I am still perfecting it, that is because there is an art to smashing your hamburger. It needs to be done quickly on a scorching hot flat top and with the right utensils to get it thin enough. Otherwise, you end up with a burger on a tortilla! Not a bad thing necessarily, but not the smash taco you are looking for.

My other favorite Mexican food item is refried beans. I love them. If you have ever had homemade refried beans, you will never go back to store-bought again. And when you realize just how easy refried beans are to make, you will definitely never go back to store-bought refried beans. I make my refried beans two different ways. I usually can them so that they are always ready on the shelf. However, for those times when I have run out of jars of beans, I make them in the Instant Pot. This is the recipe that I am going to share with

you today. They are made with dried pinto beans. Pinto beans are shelf-stable and last forever in your pantry. You can keep the necessary ingredients on hand at all times, and you should! The one utensil you will need to have is an immersion blender. You can find these on Amazon or at Walmart, and they are not very expensive. I use my immersion blender for so many things in the kitchen. It's a great tool to have!

With grilling season upon us, give these tacos a try. And if you have a Blackstone or a similar flat top, even better! You can make all the tacos at once! Enjoy!

SMASH TACOS

Ingredients

- 1 lb ground beef
- Taco seasoning
- 8 small corn or flour tortillas
- Cheese and taco toppings of choice

Instructions

- 1. Mix your taco seasoning into your hamburger
- 2. Portion out the beef and make 8 small golf ball sized balls, size depends on your tortillas
- 3. Heat up a large skillet or griddle to high heat. Add butter or your favorite oil
- 4. Place the beef on the griddle then add tortilla on top and smash it down (use another skillet or something the size of your tortillas to smash it down)





UNVEILING THE NEED FOR ONGOING FUNDRAISING FOR PINEWOOD FIRE DISTRICT

The good news is the bond measure passed, providing building funds for a new fire station in Munds Park! Bids have been accepted, and the contractor will be selected by the end of next month, with the design scheduled for completion in early Fall. Weather permitting, we should witness the groundbreaking in the Spring of 2024.

So, why do we need another fundraiser? First, Pinewood is a Fire District, not a Fire Department. The distinction between the two is unknown to most people, but it holds significant implications for accessing resources. Fire departments are funded by the city coffers and are part of the city government. On the other hand, fire districts are special tax districts established by voters to add fire and medical services in places where none exist, such as rural and unincorporated areas (Munds Park is an unincorporated area). Funding for a district comes solely from property taxes and is limited to no more than a 5% increase per year, regardless of the increase in property value. The tax rate applied to Munds Park properties in 2022 was 3.3% of the LPV (limited property value). This rate is determined by the county, not our fire district, and it is not keeping up with inflation or gas prices. That's where our annual Agee's Labor Day Fundraiser comes in, as it helps raise money along with generous contributions from the Pinewood Property Owners Association and the Pinewood Fire Department Auxiliary.

The bond will cover the design and demolition of the existing structure, and rebuilding of a new, modern station. However, it does not include funding

for "finishing" touches. Remember, the firefighters live at the station during their 48-hour shifts. The bond will not cover the costs of beds, bedding, chairs, kitchen tables, small appliances and cookware, commercial refrigerators and freezers, expensive and specialized washers necessary for their turnouts, etc. Nor will it cover the costs of landscaping the site and ensuring the station enhances the beauty of the Park.

This year's celebration begins on Thursday, August 31, with Trivia Under the Stars, followed by the second annual Cornhole Tournament on Friday. Saturday will be the main event, featuring live bands, performers, chainsaw art, and the infamous dunk tank. And don't forget the Split the Pot drawing on Saturday night. This year, there will be three winners (and no corporate winners allowed). Remember to buy your tickets early before they are sold out. And mark your calendars for Labor Day weekend.

I could write a novel about the Pinewood Fire Department and its adventures, but I will attempt to narrow it down to a few fun-to-know facts. This year marks the 50th anniversary of our Fire Department. Here's a fun fact: it was the second agency in Arizona to be certified by the DHS (in 1976). Starting as an all-volunteer department, it has grown into a fully staffed, around-the-clock department. While many departments are staffed with just three firefighters, Pinewood Fire Department maintains a staff of five per shift. This ensures that emergency services will still be available in Munds Park even if two people are absent for 2-3 hours due to a transport. Here's another fun fact: in addition to being qualified as firefighters 1 & 2, all of our firefighters are EMTs, and at least two per shift are certified paramedics.

FINDING THE WAY TO AN ENCHANTING GARDEN IN ITALY

A Flagstaff friend, learning that I was on my way to Assisi, the home of St. Francis in central Italy, recommended that I visit an enchanting garden she had discovered on a trip years before.

"It was so peaceful," Alana explained. "I just stayed and meditated for a long time. I remember it being so serene—I'd go back again." Unfortunately, my friend Alana could not find the map from her trip to give me directions to the charming garden, but her ravings have already piqued my curiosity.

Alana said the garden was near a fresco of St. Clare, who was depicted pointing the way down the hill and out of town. Clare was a feisty little nun who, in AD 1240, repelled mercenary soldiers hired to purge the village of Assisi.

Now in Italy, I find the Basilica of Saint Clare and deduce that the fresco and garden must be nearby. So, on a quest, I search the huge stone basilica for Alana's fresco, as if for the lost ark. It must be here somewhere!

Outside I explore the building's grounds for the meditation garden. Unable to find my prize, I disappointedly thumb through my Assisi guidebook. And there it is: "The Garden of St. Clare" is located at the Church of San Damiano—about one mile away.

I hike the one-mile hillside trail through olive groves that provide dreamy, balcony-like views of the Italian countryside below. San Damiano was a small crumbling shack of a church when St. Francis was converted there. He heard the crucifix say, "Francis, go and repair my house...." So Francis did so by rebuilding the crumbling chapel with his hands. Then he spent the rest of his life metaphorically "rebuilding" the Holy Church of Rome by admonishing popes and bishops to live more simply, look toward nature for revelation, and stop their warring ways.

I visited the Basilica of St. Francis the day before with my travel partner, Dannette. Our tour guide, Brother John Copendar from Zambia, explained that the culture of St. Francis' day was all about materialism, factionalism and conquering neighboring towns. But, in his melodic African accent, he said, "The culture had its eyes off God and nature and the things above."

The priest-turned-tour-guide went further to say, "We are all created in God's image. He created each of us differently but perfectly. But, unfortunately, we as humans don't concentrate on that. Thin people want to be fat; fat People want to be skinny. People with straight hair want to have curly hair. Ones with curly want it straight. We are never satisfied until we look at ourselves as God looks at us."

Dannette, with naturally curly hair and I, with straight gave each other knowing smiles from across the crowd. Both of us are battling the "hair thing" on this trip. I had gone for a glimpse of history, but Brother John surprised me with a taste of the sweetness of God.

Now I am still waiting for the Church of San Damiano to open. The sign says it will unbolt its doors at 2 pm, and it is now 1:37. I wish that I purchased some bread and cheese. Panne e fromagge. But this morning, I decided to fast through lunch, so I brought plenty of water and no food. In this small piazza at the bottom of a beautiful stairway, we wait like patient pilgrims for the small church to open. Signs reading SILENZIO are posted everywhere. Another sign warns: NO PIC-NIC SU TUTTA L'AREA. (No picnicking in this whole area.)

A German-speaking priest comes clomping down the stone steps into the quiet piazza at a quarter of two. He speaks very loudly to a boisterous foursome of retired Americans accompanying him. Their booming voices extinguish the silence.

After the Americans continue on, the white-robed wonder opens his brown bag and eats his lunch in front of the rest of us silent visitors. However, he did turn his back slightly as he attempted to discretely stuff his mouth with panne e fromaggi. That is what made me wish I had brought bread and cheese—he was tempting me away from my fast.

Fortunately, the doors to the chapel swing open as promised at 2 pm. So I enter inside and find the cloister garden—used for silent meditation since 1240.

- 5. Make sure the tortilla is pressing down so the burger is thin and cook for about 3 minutes, then gently flip over.
- 6. Cook long enough to crisp the tortillas. You can also add your cheese at this point
- 7. Remove from heat and add desired toppings, fold over and enjoy while warm!

INSTAPOT REFRIED BEANS

Ingredients

- 1 pound dry pinto beans rinsed well
- 1 medium sweet onion diced
- 4 cloves garlic roughly chopped
- 1 jalapeno seeded and chopped
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon dry oregano
- ½ teaspoon black pepper freshly cracked
- 3 T coconut oil, vegetable oil, lard or fat of your choice
- 3 ½ C beef broth/stock
- Salt to taste

Instructions

- 1. Place rinsed beans, onion, garlic, jalapeno, cumin, oregano, black pepper, oil and broth in Instant Pot.
- 2. Cover the Instant Pot and make sure the valve is on sealing. Set instant pot by pressing the beans/chili setting and adjusting the time to 45 minutes.
- 3. When timer is complete, allow pot to come to a natural release. This will take about a half hour (could be a bit more).
- 4. Once the pressure has been released, season with salt and use immersion blender to process to desired consistency.
- 5. If desired, garnish with more jalapenos, cheese and/or cilantro before serving.

FRIED TACOS

Ingredients

- Corn tortillas (I prefer white)
- Ground beef
- Salt and pepper
- Toppings...cheese, lettuce, salsa and peas (or quacamole)

Instructions

Press a small amount of ground beef on to half of the corn tortilla. Don't make it too thick or the beef won't cook before the tortilla is crisp. Salt and pepper the beef. You can use any seasoning you like but good 'ole salt and pepper is the best. Heat your cooking oil till hot. I use avocado oil. Lay the tortilla flat in the oil for a few seconds, to soften the tortilla, then bend the meat side over the other half. Fry till crispy and then flip and fry the other side. Place sideways in a loaf pan lined with paper towels to drain the excess oil. Enjoy!!!

THE VIEW FROM HERE REMEMBERING MUNDS PARK

By William L. Cowan

I have fond recollections of the first couple of times I was in Munds Park. The first was around 1952 or so, right after one of the early Technicolor Western movies (Broken Arrow) was made in Sedona and the Schnebly Hill area. We had seen the movie at the Silver Dollar Drive-in in Phoenix, and my mom wanted to see the beauty of Schnebly Hill and Red Rock Country firsthand. I was about 7 or 8, and we crossed the road from Mormon Lake to Munds Park in my dad's old forty-nine Chrysler Woody station wagon. I remember the road went right across the middle of what is now the golf course. There was a junction down about where the condos are now, with one road heading north toward Flagstaff and the other going south to Sedona.

Three things are still vivid in my mind about that trip. One was how murderously rough the road was, with the old Chrysler dragging bottom on giant boulders and deep ruts between Munds Park and Mormon Lake. The second memory is of Foxboro Ranch, which was then a youth camp with several very colorful canoes pulled up along the banks of the lake near the lodge. The other recollection, and probably my favorite, is of my mother sitting in the seat next to my dad—a seat which just happened to be on the outside next to the tremendous drop-off on Schnebly Hill. When she saw how steep the road appeared and how far the drop-off was, I remember her sort of uttering "Ooooh Lloyd" in a tensioned and very high-pitched voice as her acrophobia set in. She shuddered at the appearance of potential imminent death that awaited us if my dad did not keep the car away from the edge of the nearly sheer precipice. This, of course, only encouraged him to drive the old station wagon even closer to the edge to make her shriek a little louder. Sort of lent new insight into the term "Flat Lander," which is so generally bandied about these days. In those days, Munds Park and Schnebly Hill were one step away from wagon road wilderness and way closer to pioneer days gone by.

My other recollection is from the summer of 1956 or 57, when the right-of-way for Interstate 17 was being extended from Stoneman Lake Road to Flagstaff. I well remember riding in the back of my dad's '55 International pickup and smelling torn-up ground and freshly pushed-over pine trees, and seeing how large the Caterpillar tractors were. As we came to Munds Park, I remember seeing work on the golf course for Northernaire, the first subdivision in Munds Park, which was starting then, even though the road was just barely being scratched through.


Well, there have been a lot of changes in those years since Munds Park was an isolated bean field in the wilderness and the state's population was around 500,000. Northernaire, the original subdivision of 221 one-acre lots, sold out, and the development then went broke. During those years, the stalwart residents were mostly all golfers. This was a pretty tight-knit community then, and golfers, who are somewhat driven individuals, took matters into their own hands. Each individual family was responsible for mowing a segment of one of three fairways or greens—usually a par 5, a par 4, and a par 3. On the weekends, you could play three holes six times to get in your 18 holes.

During the early sixties, after Northernaire struggled with bankruptcy, Oakwood was developed. Where Northernaire was a few large lots around the periphery of the open park, Oakwood was a more consolidated development in the area between the clubhouse and Lake Odell, which also had the first sewer system. Each year, a few houses were built, but again, when most of the lots were sold, the operation went broke. Most of the existing private property on the east side of the highway had been developed by then, and there were still not quite enough individuals to sustain the overhead of the clubhouse and golf course.

During the late sixties, Pinewood Development Company put together a strategic land trade with the Forest Service, and the property, of which the backbone was Oak Drive, was made available for development. Pinewood Units 1 through 8 were soon platted and offered for sale. I remember when the sewer lines were going in up on Oak Drive during the summer of 1969. There were giant rocks blasted up out of the ground, and many of the trees were badly mangled. During the rainy season that summer, the roads turned to deep mud, and the hill reminded me of World War II battle scenes, with vehicles and heavy machinery moving around amidst destruction and mud. Subsequent land trades across Munds Canyon led to the final size of today.

When you drive around the park now and see the beautiful landscape and all of the homes, it's hard to believe that this was an open meadow in an isolated wilderness only a short lifetime back.

If you get out into our spectacular Northern Arizona backwoods, please try to make the place better for your presence—do not litter and try to leave the area cleaner than you found it and enjoy Northern Arizona!"





SANITARY DISTRICT BOARD VOTES TO ENFORCE CLASS SIX FELONY FOR "THEFT OF SERVICES"

The Pinewood Sanitary District Board of Directors voted at the May 11, 2023 board meeting to direct district staff to begin reporting of violations to Arizona Revised Statute 13-3724, commonly referred to as "Obtaining Utility Service Fraudulently." The class six felony statute states it is unlawful for any customer or person to intentionally do any of the following:

- Make a connection or reconnection with property that is owned or used by a utility to provide utility service without authorization or consent of the utility.
- Prevent a utility meter or other devise that is used to determine the charge for utility services from accurately performing its measuring function
- Tamper with property that is owned or used by a utility
- Use, receive or otherwise divert utility services without the authorization or consent of the utility if the customer or person knows or has reason to know of the unlawful diversion, tampering or connection
- Divert or cause to be diverted utility services by any means
- There is a rebuttable presumption that the customer or person intentionally violated an act specified in this section if an apparatus, instrument or devise that was installed to obtain utility service without paying the full charge and is attached to the meter or device that is used to provide the utility service on the premises controlled by the customer or by the person who uses or received the utility service.



 A meter was altered, tampered with or bypassed in no measurement or an inaccurate measurement of utility services and the person occupying the property receives a benefit from the bypassed equipment

This statute has been in place for many years and is a theft charge designated as a class 6 felony where values of up to \$2000, if convicted, can be punished by a minimum of four months to a maximum of two years incarceration and fines up to \$150,000. The board decided to take this firm action due to the number of reported attempts by people in Munds Park to circumvent the sewer district by obtaining access to the system in an unauthorized manner. Additionally, anyone caught breaking into manholes or the sewer collections system shall be reported to both the Coconino Sheriff's Department and the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality. In the past, Pinewood Sanitary staff have merely informed the abusers that they must immediately stop and make required repairs to the system. Due to the increase in problem behavior, the Board is now requiring that formal complaints be processed with both governmental agencies. A 100% NO TOLERANCE POLICY.

The Rain

Climate change has been a hot topic since the late '90s. The Rain shows

what can happen when we ignore what Earth is trying to tell us. It's too late, and now it has been raining for

nineteen years. Almost the whole of North America is underwater. Those who survived the first year have been forced to take drastic measures, and those who clung to the veneer of civilization were rare.

Seventeen-year-old Tanner grew up in the rain. She and her friend Russell have been searching for a rumored Colorado refuge that is said to be high enough in elevation to remain above water. Their lives have been brutal as they travel from east to west to avoid the "face eaters" who are addicted to a mysterious drug that drives them to cannibalism and murder.

Rook Wallace is a meteorologist who joined a company called Yasper. Years after its emergency funding dried up, the company continues its stated mission to help survivors. But is the company and its founder helping? When Rook learns the insidious truth of what keeps Yasper prospering, he is forced to risk everything he valued in his former life to stop them.

Alternating between Tanner and Rook's perspectives and timelines, the story shows two separate views of the rain and how it has affected mankind. Both views are equally riveting and hopeless.

Neither group has any semblance of a prosperous and happy life to look forward to. The rain is the relentless villain of the story, although I'm not convinced that the author sold us on the science of the predicament. However, I understand there will be a sequel—or two.

I was impressed to learn that, as part of their continual training and conditioning, most firefighters are trained in backcountry rope rescue, cold water rescue, and extrication. You may also see them in front of the station each week, pushing a weighted sled while garbed in full turnouts and air tanks.

The Pinewood Fire Department covers a large area, providing an array of services to Munds Park that includes 25 miles of I-17 from Stoneman (exit#306) to Kelly Canyon (exit#331) and areas west from the rim of Sedona to approximately 8 miles east of I-17. They are an all-risk first responder team, responding to fires, EMS, hazmat incidents, and everything in between. We all hear the sirens as they respond to freeway incidents, but they do much more than that. They offer walk-in wound care, transport to Flagstaff Medical, search for lost people in the forest, respond to possible gas leaks, and check for sparks on power lines. They have even rescued a person stranded on top of the ramada at the park.

Behind all of this are committed, compassionate people who dedicate themselves and risk their lives to serve the residents of and visitors to Munds Park. If you have ever called them for a medical emergency, you have experienced their professionalism, excellent medical skills, and emotional support. There is nothing more I can say except THANK YOU for who you are and all you do.

BIRDS OF MUNDS PARK

WESTERN TANAGERS

There are three breeding tanager species found in the western United States, yet these three species come from a very large family of birds – over 200 species of tanagers are found in the tropical Americas. The species we regularly have in northern Arizona is the Western Tanager, and of all the tanagers, this species is notable for being the northernmost ranging tanager.


I like to describe the Western Tanager as one big burst of color. It looks like a flame – the male sports an orange-red head, a brilliant yellow body, and coal-black wings, back, and tail. A friend told me that she attracts them to her yard with a plant that looks a lot like the bird, the Red-Hot Poker plant. For that reason, I will buy some of those plants and try them in our front yard this year.

A couple of weeks ago, a reader reported that she had three Western Tanagers at her homemade suet cake feeder. I had a male appear for just a half minute, looking around at the feeders on my deck, but since tanagers rarely eat seeds, it did not stay. The next best bet for bringing the tanagers to your yard will be the dripping bird bath or plants bearing fruit. Dried fruit and orange halves placed on a tray or spike will also attract them.

To see another tanager species fairly common in Arizona, the Summer Tanager, you have to travel to Cottonwood, Sedona, or the surrounding area. The male is bright red all over, with the wings just a little darker red. It is hard to mistake this bird once you get your binoculars on it! I recently saw this species at the Bubbling Ponds birding hot spot in Cornville. A third species we'll find in northern Arizona, the Hepatic Tanager, is more likely to be seen at Kachina Wetlands or other spots well north of Sedona. This is a species that still eludes me.

The females of these three species are not as brightly colored as the males. They are all mostly yellow, with the Western Tanager having white wing bars.

Four Old Broads is a bawdy comedy about a retired burlesque queen, her best friend and a wacky group of misfits living in the Magnolia Place Assisted Living facility. 





SEWER DISTRICT SWITCHES TO QUARTERLY BILLING, IMPLEMENTS LATE FEES

In a cost-cutting move, hoping to save the District upwards of \$25,000 annually, the board unanimously voted to change the monthly billing to quarterly billing, effective July 1, 2023.

Instead of mailing invoices to every household monthly, the new format will save a significant amount of mailing costs and employee time and expense. The District has been studying various options in order to take advantage of technology and increase productivity while decreasing costs during this time of high inflation. The invoices will now be for a period of three months, instead of one month. Please know, you can keep submitting payments monthly, if that's your preference, or you can submit the total due by the scheduled due date. We simply will not be issuing monthly invoices.

Many options exist for Munds Park folks to pay their sewer bill in a timely manner. The District will still accept advance payments and if you have a credit on your account, you will not receive a bill. Otherwise, everyone has the option of going online to pinewoodsanitary.com and use the existing payment options available on the website. Payments can be made by PSD website Autopay, through your own bank online, or by credit card. The current fee for credit card payments is \$1.95 per \$150.00 transaction.


Expected mid-summer, another option will be available at no fee to all sewer district members. A new system entitled "Catalis", formerly Value Payment Systems, is being shared with PSD by Coconino County in another attempt to reduce costs and save money. This platform will be offered on our website as a link that will offer everyone different payment methods.

Another cost reduction program being added to district rules and regulations is to charge late payers with a formal "late fee charge". In researching options, it was discovered that PSD is the only sewer district that has not established a late charge penalty for those that have to be pursued for payment. The Board has voted to put in place a late fee policy to assist the District in obtaining timely payments in two ways. Those households who are one full payment behind will be assessed 10% of the bill. The full policy is available in the District Administrative Office. Additionally, businesses who are assessed a usage fee plus the "O & M" fee and do not submit their water bills to the District by the 20th of each month, will also be assessed a late fee of 10% of the water usage rate.

The Board hopes this will assist prompt submissions of water usage for businesses that are assessed this requirement, reducing staff time to track down a water bill so invoices can be prepared. All collected late fee's will be deposited into the District "O & M" operating funds.

- If you are on an autopay plan with your bank there is no need to make any changes.
- If you are on autopay through PSD there will be no changes. The fee will still come out once a month on the same day.
- Your total bill due date will be the 15th of the third month in the billing quarter.
 If your payment is received after this date your bill is considered late and a fee of 10% will be added.

GOD'S EXTRAORDINARY HAS NO LIMITS

Can we believe it is all true? Is there a God? Does He still do miracles? Can we trust that Jesus is Who He said He is and can do what He said He could do?

God does enough extraordinary things for us in our ordinary lives, or in the ordinary lives of people close to us, to prove that He can do the extraextraordinary thing of saving us.

In my last article I wrote about the extraordinary thing God did when he healed my wife, Sara, of her thyroid cancer. Through the prayers of the ladies at our women's retreat the weekend before her surgery, God did a miracle. The surgeon, who is not a Christian, said he had no explanation for what he found when he removed half her thyroid. We do.

Which one of the women said it the right way? Was it a combination or accumulation of all their prayers? Hard to say. What I can say is God is not limited by our imagination and ability to ask the for the only thing we can think of for Him to do. Sometimes He does things we do not ask for or will do it in way we never thought of. Sara's story did not end where I left it.

During that time, there was a woman in our church named Jan who had an issue in her gut. She had suffered for two years. She had been to doctors, tried prescriptions, over the counter meds, and changed her diet. Nothing worked. She prayed, and prayed, and prayed. So did her husband. Nothing brought her relief.

Was God not listening? Did He not care. Oh yes, He was listening and cared a great deal for her. He just had a plan that would happen on His time, not ours. And when He carried it out, it would blow us all away.

Jan did not go on the retreat where they prayed for Sara. But she was in church that Sunday. The elders of the church, still caring and concerned for Sara, not knowing she had already been healed, called her to the front of the church during our worship service. They invited anyone who wanted, to come forward, lay a hand on her, or on someone close by if they could not reach Sara, and we all prayed for her. For, Sara. Jan came up to participate.

When the prayer time was over, everyone returned to their seat, including Jan, and we got on with our worship service. Her husband noticed she had the streaks of tears on her face, and he asked why. Her reply was, she was just concerned for Sara. That was not all true, but that is what she said.

Later, she told us, she felt something inside her when we were praying for my wife. She knew something had happened to her, but she was not sure what at that time. What she discovered over the following couple of weeks was, God healed her during that prayer time.

It was extraordinary that Elizabeth could conceive and deliver a healthy son. It was extra-extraordinary that Mary would.

So, is it true? Is Jesus Who He said He is, and can He do what He said He could do? Yes. How can we know for sure? Because God will do extraordinary things in our ordinary lives, or in the ordinary lives of people close to us, to prove He can do the extra-extraordinary thing of saving us. He is still in the miracle business. He does it His way and in His time. He is not bound by our imagination and ability to ask the right way for the only thing we can think of for Him to do. Sometimes, God will do something for us we never thought to ask for.

God's extraordinary has no limits. And we are the beneficiaries of his extraordinary works of love that prove we can trust that He will take care of us forever.




