LEARN ABOUT M.U.T.S & Get Outside, Feel Good, & Volunteer Your Time with a Great Group of People!

In 2001, frustration led a Munds Park resident to create trails in the Coconino National Forest illegally, earning a fine but sparking a conversation. The community's desire for recreational trails caught the Coconino National Forest Service's (C.N.F.S.) attention.

By 2002, the dialogue turned collaborative. Munds Park residents and the C.N.F.S. convened, birthing the Munds Park Trail Stewards (M.U.T.S.), a volunteer group committed to trail development. Their efforts culminated in a 22-mile multi-use trail system by 2005, a testament to community action and environmental stewardship.

The M.U.T.S. has since been vital in maintaining and protecting our trails surrounding the Park, embodying the spirit of cooperation between people and nature.

The Mission

We maintain and enhance the trails in Coconino National Forest near Munds Park, focusing on trailhead upkeep and promoting safe, legal use of the forest. Our collaboration with the Coconino National Forest Service supports tasks crucial for a healthy forest ecology, including litter removal.

Become a Volunteer

To support the mission, consider volunteering and working in the fresh mountain air. Experience the joy of contributing to the sustainability of the trails. Your involvement ensures these trails are maintained and enjoyed by future generations.

What to Expect as a Volunteer

Volunteers can work at any of our seven annual gatherings from April through October. Our days start in the morning at a predetermined location, where we, alongside C.N.F.S. staff, hold a safety briefing and outline the task ahead.

Our diverse trail projects include rock and fallen log removal, vegetation trimming, washout reconstruction, water diversion maintenance, and clearing trash.



Volunteers work at a pace that's comfortable for them, and by midday, we conclude our efforts to enjoy a complimentary, tasty lunch prepared and served by M.U.T.S. volunteer chefs.

The Coconino County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) proudly presents the Justice Statistics dashboard, a cutting-edge platform designed to demystify the criminal justice system for the residents of Coconino County. This interactive tool, born from the collaboration of various local agencies, serves up real-time data and trends on key aspects such as arrests, diversion programs, and probation outcomes, aiming to enhance community safety and justice system transparency.

Director Mike Jackiewicz highlights the dashboard's capability to offer residents a comprehensive view of criminal justice operations across multiple agencies, fostering a deeper understanding of their collective impact on the community. Meanwhile, Chief Deputy County Attorney Ammon Barker sees the dashboard as a vital step towards strengthening public trust through transparent data sharing, underscoring its role in promoting accountability and showcasing the positive strides made in community justice.

HOW TO PROTECT YOUR PIECE OF PARADISE AS SPRING ROLLS IN

In mountain country, transitioning your cabin from the chilly embrace of winter to the fresh bloom of spring involves critical chores beyond the simple dusting off of outdoor furniture and prepping for BBQs and gatherings.

If only it were that easy!

Preparing for spring in the Park means thoroughly checking our cabins for winter damage and readying our homes for the unpredictable weather ahead. Yes, even in spring, we must be vigilant about snow. Our spring and summer are fleeting, and once the monsoon season sets in, completing any exterior maintenance becomes a challenge.

But there's more to it than just weather-proofing. It's also about protecting your land against possible wildfires. Veterans of Munds Park are well-versed in the necessary precautions, but for newcomers, understanding how to safeguard your property during wildfire season is crucial for your family's and the community's safety. Check out these helpful tips:

CHECK THE ROOF

Your roof takes a heavy beating during the winter, and if you ignore maintenance and inspection after winter storms pound your roof, you run the risk of structural and interior home damage.

Look for Damaged Shingles

Damaged and loose shingles can expose your cabin to roof leaks and water damage. If shingles are broken, water will seep underneath and eventually enter your home. Also, if any shingles are loose, strong winter winds can blow them away.

Repair Damaged Flashing

Roof flashing is sometimes overlooked but vital to a well-maintained roof. Roof flashing protects your home from water damage by diverting water from certain areas of the roof.

REPLACE OLD CAULKING

During the winter, caulking can become less elastic, separate, or crack. New caulking will expand and contract with the cold and warm weather, keeping critical junctures in your roof watertight and dry. Checking the sealant around vent pipes, chimneys, and counterflashing is essential.

TRIM TREES

Trimming trees around your roof is a must-do task to avoid roof damage as storms come thundering through. Overhanging branches can break off during a big storm and damage your roof.

Hiring a professional trained to do these tasks is best—Especially considering the height of most cabins in the Park and the rocky terrain.

CLEAN RAIN GUTTERS

Chances are, after winter storms, your gutters are full. That's bad news for your cabin. When downspouts are clogged, rainwater can spill out of your gutters and around the perimeter of your house, putting it at risk for leaks and flooding. Prepare for spring showers by removing debris from your gutters and ensuring water flows freely.

SERVICE HVAC

The start of spring is an ideal time to have your home's heating, ventilation, and cooling systems inspected and serviced by a professional. Regular maintenance not only enhances efficiency and saves money but also improves air quality. Most importantly, it helps avoid breakdowns during winter. Remember, planning maintenance ahead of winter ensures you'll stay warm, as demand is high during those months, and delays in service could leave you in the cold!

CHECK VENTS

As the snow melts away from your home's foundation, checking any vents along the foundation or in the attic is crucial. Look out for missing or damaged screens, debris accumulation, signs of insect or rodent infestation, or any other potential issues.

TAKE A WALK AROUND YOUR CABIN

As you walk around your cabin, inspect for damage or wear caused by ice, snow, or low temperatures. Check your foundation for cracks or gaps, and seal windows or doors if necessary. Similarly, examine your deck for loose or damaged boards and seal any cracks in your walkway or driveway.

CHECK YOUR PLUMBING

Inspect both the interior and exterior of your pipes for cracks or damage resulting from winter conditions. Additionally, be vigilant for any signs of leaks, wet spots, or water damage that may have occurred.

LANDSCAPING & PINE NEEDLE CLEAN UP

A hot ember from a nearby campfire, fire-pit, or wildfire can travel 5-20 miles and still retain enough heat to ignite a fire upon landing. Therefore, it's crucial for all Mundsies to do their part and ensure their property is firewise ready.

PREPARING YOUR CABIN FOR WILDFIRE SEASON

- Remove pine needles and other green waste from gutters.
- Remove leaf/pine needles within at least 10 feet of your cabin.
- Cut down or thin trees to create defensible space on your property.
- Remove tall, dry grass from the property surrounding your home.
- Trim branches that overhang your cabin, porch, and deck, and prune branches of large trees to be 6 to 10 feet from the ground.
- Regularly prune excess growth from your bushes and shrubs.

HARNESSING THE HEALING POWER OF FOOD

It's winter, and I have been hearing about a lot of colds and flu going around the park. I am a big proponent of using food and herbs to help with illnesses. I use quite a few essential oils when sick, but I also turn to foods to help

me. This month, I am going to give you recipes for things you can easily make at home for gut health, colds, and illnesses.

The first thing you want to do is build your immunity before you are even sick. There are so many foods that you can incorporate into your daily diet that will help fight off germs. Blueberries are an easy one. They are rich in antioxidants and full of vitamins and minerals. They can also help manage cholesterol and potentially reduce blood pressure. I love to drink smoothies, especially in the summer for breakfast. I am mindful of the things I put in the smoothie that are helpful for my body. Here is a recipe I like to use:

Smoothie: Frozen blueberries, 1/2 apple,

tablespoon of peanut butter, kale or leafy greens, teaspoon of turmeric, ½ teaspoon of ginger, ½ teaspoon of cinnamon, tablespoon of maple syrup, coconut water, and a handful of walnuts. This makes the best smoothie, and everything in it is good for your body!

I've written about bone broth before, but it warrants repeating. Bone broth is so easy to make and very good for you. You can freeze it or can it to have on hand when you start feeling bad. It's not only good to be used as a soup base, but drinking a cup of hot bone broth helps build immunity and also fights illness. Plus, it just tastes great!

When you make a meal with chicken or turkey and want to make broth with the bones, be sure to purchase high-quality, free-range, grass-fed animals. What the animal is raised eating is also in the bones. You are making broth at home for the health benefits. You need to make sure the animal is healthy to begin with.

bag of veggie scraps and throw it all in the Instapot. I add water to the top fill line and add any spices I desire. I also add about 1/4 cup of apple cider vinegar. This is VERY important and ensures that the bones release all the essential nutrients that you want. Then, I set the Instapot on manual for 2 hours. Once the broth is done, release the pressure and strain the broth through a fine mesh strainer. Once the broth is cool, I can freeze, can, or use it right away in a soup. Typically, I will put it in the fridge overnight for the fats to solidify on top. In the morning, I will skim that off and then use or can the broth. If you don't own an Instapot, you can cook the broth on the stove or in a crockpot. It will just take much longer. Roasting the bones

ahead of time will also help them release their nutrients and give you an even deeper flavor but is not necessary.

After a meal, I freeze my carcasses in a freezer bag. I also freeze any

vegetable scraps (onion ends and skin, carrot tops, celery ends) in a freezer

bag. When I'm ready to make broth, I pull a carcass out of the freezer and a

Something new that I am currently trying is Fire Cider. Most all the homesteaders that I follow on social media swear by it for kicking illness quickly. What is it? A homeopathic/folk remedy and has been called "the most powerful antibiotic ever" (at least, according to the internet). There are many different versions of fire cider, each person making their own adjustments, but the basics are all the same: fresh garlic, onions, ginger, horseradish, and chili peppers infused in apple cider vinegar for a desired amount of time, then the vinegar is strained and honey is added. Fire cider will keep in the refrigerator for 2 years. The list of ingredients and the recipe below were taken from an article written by Ashley from Practical Self Reliance.

As they say, 'all roads lead to Rome,' and now might be the perfect time to start planning your trip to the Eternal City. Rome, one of my favorite destinations, is a mecca for history, art and architecture enthusiasts as well as religious devotees. Here are some fun tips for putting together your own Roman holiday.

Via Appia, or the Appian Way, was one of the first roads that led to Rome. Construction was begun in 312 BC as a military highway, and it has been used since then by those who crucified Spartacus in 73 BC, Apostle Paul in Acts 28:15, American soldiers during WWII and Olympic marathoners in the 1960 Summer Games. Today, you can follow the beaten path through Parco Regionale Dell'Appia Antica like I did when I left Rome on my walking pilgrimage across southern Italy. Trod the ancient stone pavers on Sundays and holidays when the park is closed to vehicular traffic.

La Bocca della Verità was made famous in the classic movie Roman Holiday starring Audrey Hepburn and Gregory Peck. The Mouth of Truth is a first-century, disc-shaped carving of a horribly ugly man sporting a gaping mouth (bocca). Legend has it that if you tell a lie with your hand in the grimacing stone mouth, your hand will be bitten off. So why would someone put their hand in the mouth?

Santa Maria Immacolata a Via Veneto

Watch the movie and find out why Peck's character risked his phalanges. Anyone on their way to Rome should revisit that romantic comedy anyway. Located in the portico of Santa Maria in Cosmedin church.

Sistine Chapel is famous for its frescoed ceiling painted by Michelangelo, who lay on his back balanced on high scaffolding. But don't miss the works of other Renaissance masters, Botticelli, Ghirlandaio, Perugino, Pinturicchio, and Luca Signorelli on the walls. My girlfriend and I got to the Vatican Museum ticket booth early to be one of the first in the door. We raced to the Sistine Chapel ahead of the crowds to lie on the floor to view the ceiling from Michelangelo's perspective. Closed Sunday.

Rome Free Walking Tour, a group of licensed tour guides, offers tours in English and Spanish Monday through Saturday at 10 am for the Vatican Tour and 4 pm for the Colosseum Tour. No reservations are needed. Simply meet at Piazza di Spagna, next to the tall column and the big Spanish flag of the Spanish Embassy. The professional guides work for your tips, so give them what they deserve!

Follow the stairs down beneath the church of Santa Maria della Concezione dei Cappuccini to the narrow Capuchin Crypt. Human skulls and bones of Capuchin monks who died in the 1500s-1700s decorate the walls and ceilings of the creepy tombs. Femurs make zigzag designs through patterns of skulls. The crypts seem to go on forever, miming the eternal nature of mortality and hopefully inspiring viewers to choose life through Jesus Christ.

Ecstasy of Saint Theresa - You'll have to walk off the beaten path to find this luminescent sculpture in the Cornaro Chapel inside the Santa Maria della Vittoria church. Unfortunately, whenever I've tried to visit the marble masterpiece by Gian Lorenzo Bernini, the church was closed for siesta. Open 6:45 am-noon and 4-7 pm. The sculpture completed in 1652 depicts Teresa of Ávila in the High Roman Baroque style.

FIRE CIDER

Apple Cider Vinegar is valuable for cold and flu care as it can soothe sore throats, help with digestion issues, thin mucus, reduce congestion (so that runny nose or a cough), boost energy, and kill free radicals.

Ginger is a warming and decongesting herb, and is antiinflammatory, anti-bacterial, and anti-viral. Ginger helps with imbalances such as poor circulation, colds, and bouts of

the flu. It has been shown to reduce inflammation and is effective for nausea and gastrointestinal infections.

Horseradish is a potent infection fighter. Ounce for ounce, horseradish has more medicinally active compounds than any other spice. It is useful for treating upper respiratory problems, reducing inflammation, fights bacteria and viruses, and helps relax muscles. Like the vinegar, it also helps clear congestion and thins mucus. Yummy, right?

Onion can help lower cholesterol, regulate blood sugar, and kill cancer cells. They are anti-inflammatory and can help relax the airway muscles and asthma systems. Onions are rich in antioxidants, which protect the body against free radicals, which encourage a strong immune system.

Garlic is one of the most versatile culinary herbs for treating colds, the flu, sore throats, and poor digestion. It boosts the body's immune systems and is antiseptic, anti-bacterial, and anti-microbial, making it effective against many types of infections, even those found to be from antibiotic-resistant strains of bacteria.

Chili gets its healing powers from its main constituent Capsaicin. It stimulates circulation, digestion, and signals the brain to release endorphins. It can aid and support the immune system, relieve congestion, and is anti-parasitic.

Citrus is a vitamin C powerhouse. It also tastes good.

Honey is loaded with anti-bacterial and anti-fungal properties. It can help suppress coughs and helps with sleep. It adds a balancing sweetness to the other pungent ingredients, basically making it drinkable.

FIRE CIDER RECIPE

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup freshly grated ginger root (peeled or not)
- 1/2 cup freshly grated horseradish root (peeled)
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 10 cloves garlic, chopped
- 2 spicy peppers, chopped if fresh (such as jalapeno or cayenne)
- 1 lemon, sliced or chopped
- 1 quart raw apple cider vinegar
- 1/4 cup, or more, local raw honey

Optional Ingredients

Orange, Lime, Grapefruit, Rosemary, Thyme, Oregano, Fresh Turmeric, Rosehips, Juniper berries, Star Anise, Schisandra berries, Astragalus, Parsley, Burdock, Echinacea, Peppercorns, Cinnamon, Yarrow, and/or Elderberry

Instructions

- 1. Place all prepared ingredients in a large glass jar. Cover with the apple cider vinegar.
- 2. Close the jar. If using a metal lid, put a piece of parchment between the glass and the lid, to keep the vinegar from touching the metal.
- 3. Set aside in a dark spot, shaking daily (or as remembered).
- 4. Let steep for 3-4 weeks, then use cheesecloth or a fine sieve

Take 1-2 T daily for immune support. You can take it straight or put in in a drink/glass of water. If you are sick, you can take a shot 1-2 times daily and even gargle with it before drinking if you have a sore throat.

I currently have mine steeping in the pantry! I can't wait to try it out!

PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE: WILLARD SPRINGS OPENS SOON, COMMUNITY CLEANUP DAYS & MORE!

WILLARD SPRINGS OPENS FRIDAY, APRIL 5

The Willard Springs Green Waste Station will reopen for the 2024 summer season on Friday, April 5, 2024. It will then be open Fridays and Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. until Saturday, October 26, 2024, when it will close for the 2024 - 2025 winter season. The station will again offer free green waste-only disposal. Please note that the station does not accept bulk or household waste.

SPRING GREEN WASTE CLEANUP EVENTS

Spring is on the way, and that means it's almost time for everyone to start cleaning up pine needles, branches, and other green waste from around their properties before the 2024 wildfire season arrives. This year there are again several events to help residents get their properties ready for fire season:

BEAR JAW CLEANUP: MONDAY, APRIL 29

This spring, Bear Jaw Interagency Fires & Fuels will once again help residents create defensible spaces around their properties by providing free pickup and disposal of branches, logs, small trees, leaves and pine needles. If you clear woody vegetation from around your home and stack it in a slash pile, then Bear Jaw will chip it and haul it away at no cost. Bear Jaw also will accept up to fifteen (15) clear bags of green waste (pine needles and leaves) per property. Public Works will be accepting all this woody vegetation from Bear Jaw for free at the Willard Springs Green Waste Station.

Only clear plastic bags of green waste will be accepted during the Bear Jaw Cleanup! Clear bags will be provided free of charge at the Pinewood Fire Station in early April. IMPORTANT: Please have all green waste items out along the roadside by 7:30 a.m. on Monday, April 29!

HER STORY, O THE FIRE OF FRANCES L

A WOMEN'S HISTOR

Frances Lillian Willard Munds, not just a name etched in the books of history but a force of nature, blazing through the early 20th century with a fervor for women's rights that would put even the most passionate activists of our time to shame. As the calendar flips to Women's History Month, it's high time we spill the tea on one of the most badass women to ever strut through the dusty streets of Arizona—Frances Munds. A woman whose legacy is as fiery as her spirit, and whose contributions to women's suffrage weren't just noteworthy; they were revolutionary.

Frances married John Lee Munds, dived headfirst into Prescott, Arizona's social whirlpool, and started popping out ideas (and three kids) that would change the state forever. And her husband? Oh, he was just the local sheriff and a pioneering rancher, because why not add a dash of Wild West flair to this epic tale?

So, here's where the story becomes genuinely inspirational: women's suffrage. Frances wasn't just fighting for the right to vote; she was orchestrating a symphony of strategy, diplomacy, and sheer willpower. She was at the helm of the Arizona Women's Suffrage Association, cutting deals with labor unions, hobnobbing with political adversaries, and basically doing whatever it took to ensure Arizona women could hit the polls by 1912—and she did it a whole eight years before the rest of the nation caught up.

But Frances's strategy was far from ordinary; it was revolutionary. Recognizing the limitations of relying solely on politicians, she shifted her focus towards building support among male voters. Frances, alongside Pauline O'Neill, reached out to women to enlist their support for women's suffrage and cast a wider net, appealing to individuals from all walks of life, seeking common ground and forging alliances across a spectrum of societal factions. In 1909, she masterminded a coalition with the Western Federation of Miners, securing their support for women's suffrage in exchange for advocating labor issues. This ability to unite diverse groups labor leaders, farmers, ranchers, Democrats, Republicans, socialists, progressives, and populists—underscored a visionary approach. Imagine, in our times, if politicians could transcend their divides, coming together for the common good. Frances Munds exemplified this ethos, showcasing how collaboration across seemingly insurmountable differences can bring monumental change.

Frances didn't just stop with getting the vote; no, she kicked down the doors of the Arizona Senate in 1914, making history as the state's first female senator. With a focus on education and land policy, she wasn't just filling a seat; she was setting a precedent, proving that women's places were in the houses of power, making decisions, and taking names.

A WEE BIT O' WARMTH WITH THE LEGENDARY IRISH COFFEE

In the journey of culinary history, nestled between the rugged cliffs and rolling mists of 1940s Ireland, there's a story as rich and inviting as the drink it inspired—The story of Irish Coffee, a blend of innovation and comfort that could only have been concocted in a place where the wind bites sharply, and the whiskey flows freely.

The origin of Irish Coffee is as much about atmosphere as it is about ingredients. At Foynes' Port, near Limerick—an epicenter

It was a moment of branding genius—A blend of humor and savvy that turned a simple beverage into an icon.

The drink's journey to international fame was spearheaded by Stanton Delaplane, a travel writer who knew a good story—and a good drink when he saw one. Delaplane introduced Irish Coffee to the United States, specifically to the Buena Vista Café in San Francisco, where the quest to replicate Sheridan's concoction became a culinary crusade. It was a task that required precision and persistence, from mastering the perfect pour of cream to ensuring the coffee's robustness could stand up to the whiskey's warmth.

Sheridan's eventual relocation to San Francisco, to oversee the making of Irish Coffee at the Buena Vista Café, was the final twist in this beverage's journey from local warmth to global phenomenon. Today, Irish Coffee is a testament to the power of simple pleasures and the artistry of combining them. It's a celebration of cultural exchange, a reminder that sometimes, the most enduring traditions start with a bit of fearlessness and a lot of heart.

Ingredients

- ³/₄ cup your favorite strong hot Coffee
- 1-2 teaspoons of Brown Sugar (Brown sugar is better because of the molasses tones that bring out the whisky flavor.)
- 1-ounce Irish Whiskey
- 1-2 tablespoons Heavy Whipping Cream (or double cream)

Directions

- 1. Freshly brew your favorite coffee.
- 2. Fill footed mug or a mug with hot water to preheat it, then empty.
- 3. Pour piping hot coffee into warmed glass until it is about 3/4 full.
- 4. Dissolve sugar in coffee
- 5. Add Irish whiskey
- 6. Top with whipped cream.

Probably, most of us either hosted a party or went to a party to watch the game. Whoever was hosting had to get their house ready for the people to arrive. And those arriving had to get themselves cleaned up and ready in their new red and yellow or crimson and gold apparel. The house may be a wreck 364 days during the year. But the one day you host a party when people come over, it has got to be clean.

If it were at our house, Sara would be cleaning like crazy all day Friday and Saturday. It is not that our house stays dirty. She does a great job with it. But between Jack, 5-year-old Australian Shepherd who sheds the equivalent of a dog every few days and our wood stove that spews ashes into the air all the time; there is plenty to do to make our house presentable.

I have my work, too. The trash must be empty so we can fill it up with the remnants of all the great snacks. The firewood must be stocked up and stacked up because the snow is still stacked up and the temperatures are still down. Together, we get the place ready for guests.

Do you know what the first thing Jesus did when He began His public ministry? He cleaned house. When the temple was first built it was a beautiful place. It had become a huge mess. The people who occupied the space had turned it into a nasty, animal infested, marketplace. It would have been like going into the lobby of the church and finding pens and cages filled with animals. There was hay and fodder for food. And where there is input, there is output. We all know what barnyard smells like.

The nastiness would have offended all five senses.

Not only were there animals and birds for sale; sheep, calves, goats, and pigeons; there had to be tables for business with the first century equivalent of cash registers and cash boxes.

The business was a racket, too. Only approved animals could be used for worship in the temple. And approved animals could only be purchased at the temple. So, they sold them for a premium, taking advantage of the people who came with pure intentions to do right by God and worship the way He commanded.

The people had taken a place that once was filled with the pleasant smells of incense, sights of polished precious metals, and 'nastified' it up. Jesus was not happy with what they had done to His Father's house. So, He cleaned it up. He chased out the animals, shooed the birds, turned over the tables, and scattered the cash as it flew out of the cash boxes. And the people were angry. So, including Jesus, everybody in the temple that day was mad.

Why did Jesus clean house? Because that is what Jesus does. When we invite Him in, He cleans us up. That is what He came to do. We do not have to clean ourselves up before He comes in. Because, the next time we see Him, He will be ushering us in to the room he has prepared for each one of us.
